transfer of additional thousands of Chinese nationalist troops into Manchuria (to "handle" the communists there).

Chinese nationalist troops are reported only 30 miles from Mukden (in Manchuria) after what is described as a practically unchallenged drive in that direction.

AGAIN we must put two and two together—for, of course, following the ancient diplomatic precedent of secrecy, nobody in authority in Washington will TELL us anything.

IT LOOKS as if Russia is going along with the program to crush communist opposition and unite China under the Chiang Kai-Shek government. Which would mean, if true, that a three-cornered deal among us, the Russians and the Chungking Chinese has been completed.

(Judging by Hurley's disclosures, there seems to have been some sort of squabble in our own State department over whom we shall back in China—the communists or the Chungking nationalists. The pro-Chungking faction among our silk-hatted, striped pants warriors appears to have won.)

ON the troubled home front, Truman's plans to minimize strike disorders appear to be running into a solid wall of opposition from the country's top-ranking union leaders—AFL, Green, CIO, Murray and UMW Lewis.

In a speech described by the reporters as "biting," Murray says the Truman plan is "designed to weaken and ultimately destroy labor union organizations."

(It ISN'T, of course. No administration could survive such an attempt in these days. But their is a rising tide of public displeasure with what is happening. That is why Truman is beginning to move. He FEARS this rising tide.)

TRUMAN'S plan hasn't yet emerged very definitely. It includes a "fact-finding board" to dig up the facts about proposed strikes. What will happen after the facts are found hasn't yet been clearly set forth. Obviously finding the facts can be only a preliminary step.

THERE is an interesting suggestion from Washington, where the acting chairman of the House Labor committee, Representative Ranspcker, a Georgia Democrat, tells a reporter he believes the committee will approve the Truman proposals.

If it does, and if congress approves a law embodying the Truman suggestions in such a form as to ANGER the big labor leadership, the next election will become more or less a REFERENDUM, with members of congress who voted for the law defending their positions and new candidates who want their jobs attacking them.

In such a case, the next election will determine our future labor policies.

IT seems to this writer that fundamentally collective bargaining agreements are simple business contracts which should be backed by full financial and moral responsibility on BOTH sides and construed in case of dispute or violation by the local courts—the same as any other business contracts.

ENCOURAGE A GOOD WORK

Completing its first round of all Oregon counties, the mobile x-ray unit, sponsored by the Oregon Tuberculosis Association, will be in Douglas county from Saturday through Wednesday. We would urge every Douglas county resident, who can take advantage of this opportunity for a free examination to determine the possible presence of tuberculosis, to register for the test.

Milk bottles, marked with the name Doernbecher hospital, have been placed in the stores of Roseburg to receive contributions of all persons interested in helping the hospital. Doernbecher hospital is open to all children of Oregon between the ages of 1 and 14, needing hospitalization.

Plates are forwarded to state headquarters in Portland where a panel of four experts examines each picture to locate any possible trace of tuberculosis. The applicant will receive through the mail a report from his test. If further examination is advisable, the applicant will be so informed.

The entire service is furnished free of charge. Examinations are primarily for adults and young people. No children under six years of age will be accepted, except by special arrangement.

The T-B Association has found that one of the most effective ways of combatting the disease is to secure periodic chest examinations. If all people could be provided the opportunity and required to obtain chest x-rays at regular intervals, tuberculosis soon could be virtually eliminated, as a threat to public health.

The first circuits of Oregon counties will be completed with scheduled stops in Douglas and Lane counties on the current trip. Another circuit is to be started in the near future and Douglas county will be visited again in the early spring, according to present plans.
