THERE will be a terrific outcry in this country to the effect that the British are getting off cheap and we are paying the bill. On the face of it, it does look that way.

THIS writer's advice is to keep an open mind throughout the discussion (much of it super-heated) that will follow. Take all the circumstances into consideration. Draw your own conclusions.

REMEMBER this much: Lend-lease is a contract ALREADY MADE. We went into it voluntarily—presumably with our eyes open.

THE principle of lend-lease was that each would contribute to a common cause (the winning of the war) ACCORDING TO HIS ABILITY. Accepting this principle, we contributed more because we were ABLE to contribute more.

It is much like the accepted principle of taxation according to ability to pay. Under this principle, the big man pays more than the little man.

REMEMBER this also: We financed World War I on the principle of loans to be repaid in full later. It didn't work. Practically none of the loans were repaid.

INCLUDED in the settlement is a pledge by the governments of Britain and the United States to work together in an effort to achieve worldwide expansion of trade and employment by reducing tariffs, cartels and other trade barriers.

That sounds idealistic and impractical, but is MUCH LESS so than it sounds. After all, we can raise our standards of living ONLY BY MORE PRODUCTION AND MORE TRADE.

It is only by producing more that we can have more to consume. The sooner we can learn that fundamental lesson, the more we and our children and our grandchildren can have.
