## Pvt. W. M. Hughes Claimed by Death; Rites Here Friday

Walter Melvin Hughes, age 23, private first class, U. S. Army, died at Camp Kilmer, New Jersey, Dec. 7. He was born at Roseburg, April 10, 1922. He moved to Coos Bay from Roseburg, and was graduated from high school in that city with the class of 1940. He worked in the shipyards at Portland, Oregon, for several months and then enlisted in the Army.

Surviving are his father, W. F. Hughes, Roseburg; his mother, Mrs. Marion Bell, Blaine, Wash.;

a brother, Cpl. George M. Hughes, U. S. Marine Corps, stationed at Pendleton, Oregon, and his grandfather, M. D. Hughes of Coos Bay.

The body is being shipped to Roseburg, accompanied by Sgt. Orville Greig, military escort. Services will be held at the chapel of the Douglas Funeral Home Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock, with Rev. H. P. Sochne conducting. Interment will follow in the I.O.O.F. Cemetery, Roseburg.

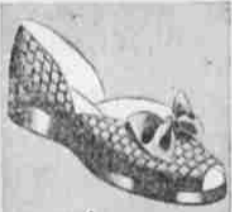

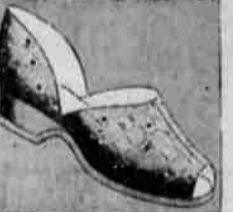
