Producers of Grade A Milk Demand Price Boost

GRANTS PASS, Ore., Dec. 13—In a plea for higher prices on Grade A milk, the increased cost of production was pointed out in a petition submitted to OPA this week by the Josephine County Grade A Producers and Distributors.

Now allowed a ceiling of 85 cents, the petition cites present costs of materials and services necessary to produce Grade A milk in showing that cost of production has risen to \$1.21 per pound of butterfat.

22 Denominations on Willamette U. Roster

SALEM, Ore., Dec. 13—Students at Willamette University belong to 22 religious denominations, Prof. John L. Knight, university religious counselor, said.

Hirohito's White Horse Will Be Brought to U. S.

TOKYO, Dec. 13—(AP)—The most controversial horse in Japan—White Frost, described by the Army as Emperor Hirohito's own mount—is going to the United States as the property of an American lieutenant.

The Japanese Racing Association today ceremoniously turned over the much publicized white Arabian to Lieut. Dick Ryan, who discovered him five weeks ago in isolated but elaborate stables.

A change in Army regulations will make it possible for the lieutenant to take White Frost to the States—where he plans to exhibit the horse at veterans' hospitals, civil and charitable events.

If nothing goes amiss, White Frost will go aboard an American Liberty ship at Yokohama within a few days when Ryan starts home for discharge. Frost will be carried on deck and will not occupy any space in which a soldier might be transported, Ryan said.

Some Japanese sources deny that White Frost is the horse on which Hirohito was seen astride in so many prewar pictures. Others say he was too high-strung to be ridden by the emperor in review, was given to another member of the royal family and finally placed in the association stables. But most sources agree he did come from the royal stables—ridden or unriden by Hirohito.

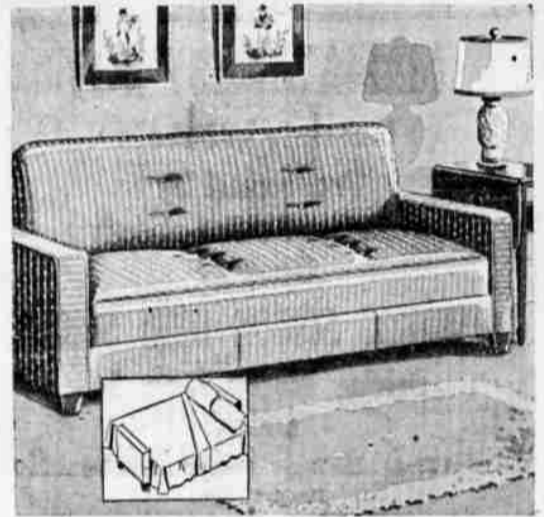
