

Apprenticeship of Roseburg Students Given Evaluation

An evaluation of the apprenticeship program of the Roseburg schools was being conducted here this week by Harold W. Shogren, assistant state supervisor of trade and industrial education for the State Board of Education.

The apprenticeship plan, which originated in Roseburg in 1928 and has spread to 17 school systems in the state, permits students to attend school part time, and be apprenticed to shops and plants in town, Shogren said. For the size of the city, Roseburg has as large an apprenticeship program as any city in the State, he asserted.

Approximately 50 students are enrolled here in the apprenticeship program, Frank France, instructor in Roseburg High School, said today. They are apprenticed to five or six different trades in town as well as to local business offices and stores, he said. France is co-ordinator for the Roseburg Apprenticeship Council.

Frank W. Chase, manager of the U. S. Employment Service here, heads the Apprenticeship Council, which includes representatives from business and labor. Senator Tom Parkinson, R. D. Coen and Jim Mess are business representatives. Frank Wilson and John Conlison, both carpenters, are labor representatives appointed through the Roseburg Central Labor Council.

Chase expressed a hope that there would be CIO representation as well as AFL representation in the future. There has been no change in membership of the council during the war years, he said, and a reorganization is planned soon.

Chase praised the apprenticeship plan as "wonderful" and expressed the feeling of the council that the work does more to fit students for making a living than

many other courses of study do. The Apprenticeship Council also co-operates with the Veterans' Administration in placing returned soldiers in apprenticeship, France said.

Coach at U. of O. Speaker at R. H. S. Football Banquet

An interesting history of the evolution of football, illustrated by anecdotes of football's great players and coaches, was presented Wednesday night by John Warren, University of Oregon athletic coach, who was the principal speaker at the second annual football banquet sponsored by the Roseburg Lions Club. The Lions had as guests the members of the 1945 Roseburg High School football squad and parents of the players, together with school officials and a number of invited guests. Coach Warren was accompanied to Roseburg by Bill Abbey, quarterback of the Oregon varsity team.

Paul Geidies, serving as toastmaster, conducted the program, which, in addition to the talk by Warren, included introduction of the football squad by Coach Mel Ingram, reading of a message from Bob Krell, member of last year's Roseburg team and center for the Oregon State varsity for the 1945 season; vocal solo by Ed Harvey, Roseburg High School football star; accordion solos by Allan Gordon, selection by high school sextette, directed by Les Irvin, and group singing led by Les Irvin and Charles V. Stanton, with Frances Lintott at the piano.

In introducing his players, Coach Ingram urged an expanded athletic program starting at least with the sixth grade. How to make holiday baking easy

Time to start thinking about all those good things you can bake now and keep for holiday eating. And here are recipes for an Apple Sauce Fruit Cake and some delightful cookies... examples of how easy it is to turn those thoughts into delicious things-to-eat. No need to worry for they keep perfectly.

APPLE SAUCE FRUIT CAKE

An easy-to-make cake that will store for a number of weeks if kept in a cool, dry place.

2 cups flour	1 egg
1/2 tsp. salt	1 cup unsweetened sieved applesauce
1/2 tsp. soda	1 cup sliced candied fruit
2 tps. baking powder	1/2 cup seedless raisins
1 tsp. cinnamon	1/2 cup chopped nutmeats
1/2 tsp. nutmeg	
1/4 tsp. cloves	
1/4 tsp. allspice	
1/2 cup shortening	
1 cup brown sugar firmly packed	

Sift and measure flour; sift again with salt and spices. Cream shortening and sugar until light and fluffy; beat in egg. Add applesauce and flour mixture alternately; beat until smooth. Add fruit and nutmeats. Pour into well-greased loaf pan (9x4x3) and bake in moderate oven (350° F.) for 1 hour or until done. Makes one loaf cake.

GINGERSNAPS

1/2 cup shortening	2 3/4 cups flour
1 cup sugar	1 tsp. cinnamon
1 egg, beaten	2 tps. ginger
1 tsp. soda	1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 cup dark molasses	

Cream shortening and sugar together until light and fluffy; add egg. Stir in combined soda and molasses. Sift and measure flour; sift again with cinnamon, ginger and salt. Blend well into creamed mixture. Place balls on lightly-greased cookie sheet about 1 1/2 to 2 inches apart. Bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) 15 to 18 minutes, or until done. Remove to rack and cool. Makes 5 to 6 dozen cookies.
