Angling Rules For Oregon Streams Tentatively Set

The 1946 angling regulations were tentatively set by the Oregon State Game Commission at its meeting held in Portland on January 12.

The general season for trout six inches or over in length will be from April 20 to October 31 in all counties except Lake County.

The taking of trout ten inches or over in the coastal waters during the winter months will be prohibited except in the specified portion of the North and South Umpqua rivers.

Salmon and steelhead twenty inches and over may be taken the year around as before with the exception of certain waters for which specific seasons are set.

Black bass hereafter may be taken the year around in all counties except in Klamath County waters which will be closed during May and June to such fishing.

Perch in most waters where this species is established, the bag limit on these fish was taken off. Otherwise, the bag limit for spiny-rayed fish remains the same as before.

29,000 Innocent Hostages Slain By Nazis, Court Told. NUERNBERG, Jan. 25.—(AP)—France charged today that the Nazis executed at least 29,000 innocent hostages in their occupation of the fallen republic.

Charles DuBois, the French prosecutor, made the accusation before the international military tribunal and attributed prime responsibility to Marshal Wilhelm Keitel and former Reichsmarschal Hermann Goering.

Another defendant, Baron Constantin von Neurath, former foreign minister and "protector" of Bohemia and Moravia, was called Hitler's "handiest tool" in German plans for conquest.

DuBois accused Keitel of ordering 50 to 100 French Communists to be shot for each German killed in France, and said similar instructions to seize and execute hostages were sent to commanders in Belgium, Norway, Holland, Denmark, the Ukraine, Serbia and Greece.

QUIT PASSING THE BUCK

Considerable discussion concerning public housing for Roseburg and vicinity has been held recently in committee rooms at the Chamber of Commerce office.

The housing proposition is a big undertaking. It involves much hard work, many headaches, a vast amount of red tape, detailed planning, and a considerable expenditure of money.

We do not say this in way of criticism, for we realize that during the war period, when all businesses were short handed and everyone was working overtime in personal enterprises, it was only natural that additional labors be avoided whenever possible.

But we feel this public housing project to be too serious and critical to be shoved aside. Instead of passing the buck, hoping some other agency will take over, all groups should attack the subject vigorously and cooperatively.

Under present arrangements, it is required that some municipal body must act as sponsor for a veterans' housing project. The sponsor, which may be the county, city, school district, or other organized public body, must furnish a site, streets, sidewalks and extension of sewers, water mains, electric and gas lines.

We believe the FHHA regulations to be unfair in one respect. It is provided that the sponsoring group shall receive \$15 per year on each dwelling unit to pay the cost of utility installations, and that payments shall be made in lieu of taxes.

We believe, however, that this housing situation is too serious and too critical to permit further procrastination. We should quit passing the buck and unite our efforts in a serious, aggressive and cooperative spirit to achieve at least partial elimination of the bottleneck to community progress.

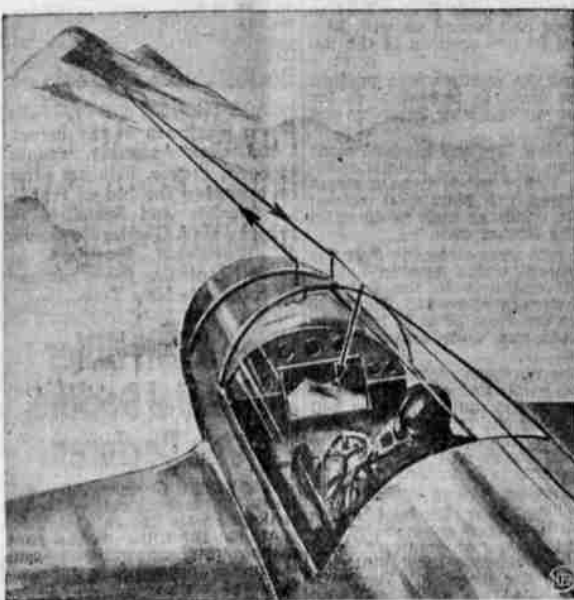
