Carson Will Not Seek Governor Nomination

PORTLAND, Feb. 1.—(AP)—Col. Joseph K. Carson announced today he would not seek the Democratic nomination for governor this spring, nor "any political office in 1946."
The former Portland mayor, mentioned as a possible Democratic candidate since his return from service, declared that "what I am going to do is to practice law, and do it just as vigorously as I know how."
Carson said that while "frankly, I would feel honored to be governor," he did not feel he could afford the time or expense involved.

SALEM, Ore., Feb. 1.—(AP)—The Columbia River Highway, which has been closed for several weeks at the east city limits of Astoria, was reopened today to normal traffic, the State Highway Commission announced.

Traffic has been detouring around the closed section, going through the Tongue Point Naval base.

MILWAUKEE, Ore., Feb. 1.—(AP)—A woman shipyard worker was freed of a 60-day jail sentence today provided she quits her job and takes care of her daughters.
Mrs. Edith Buchholz was sentenced to 60 days and fined \$20 for allowing her 12-year-old daughter to stay out of school to care for a little sister. The woman's husband testified the family had sufficient means without her working.
Justice of the Peace G. W. Thiessen said he would not impose either sentence or fine if the woman remained at home.
