May Have Juggled Files
Kramer told the joint congressional committee investigating the disaster that in addition to the "JD" file—the letters stood for Japanese Diplomatic traffic—there were six other file groupings for intercepted Japanese messages. Those were "JM" (military), "JN" (naval), "JO" (official), "JP" (personal), "JQ" (commercial) and "JZ" (traffic whose classification could not be determined).
There is a possibility, he said, that a translation had been grouped erroneously in the JD file, given a JP number, and later placed in the proper file with the JD crossed out and another heading substituted.
Earlier, the committee received a letter written January 15, 1946, to Safford by Capt. G. W. Welker, another communications officer in Safford's section. Welker said that he had no first hand information of any "winds" message, and that no information of that kind ever came to his office through Kramer.

followed the Morgenthau plan, Landon said yesterday in Tokyo, the United States must decide whether to "continue to feed Germany, reverse our policy, or be a modern-day Genghis Khan."
Describing the policy to a heritage which they late President Roosevelt had left Mr. Truman, Landon said it was "both silly and criminal" to pursue it because "it is an utter failure."
Morgenthau Hits Back
In New York, Morgenthau said: "I recommend that Mr. Landon buy a copy of my book and read it. He obviously doesn't know what he is talking about. I think his statement is vicious."
"Mr. Truman went to Potsdam. The policy that followed the result of his meeting with representatives of Great Britain and Russia."
Meanwhile, there was additional evidence of government concern over current crops. Officials are in a position to know disclosed privately that the United States is seeking to arrange for the importation of at least 50,000 Mexican farm laborers on a temporary basis to help toward the coming harvest. The plan would be similar to that in effect during the war when the manpower pinch was tight.
Home Aid First Sought
Hall, who introduced the bill running counter to Mr. Truman's proposal, is a member of the House agricultural committee. Besides seeking to assure the present amount of white bread in this country, it also would provide for distribution of sufficient grain to "areas of the United States now suffering from shortages of livestock and poultry feeds."
While some other farm-state Congressmen saw in Mr. Truman's plan the danger of new livestock and poultry shortages, many Senate and House members generally were sympathetic with his aim of getting the greatest amount of food possible to starving Europe.
Chairman Elmer Thomas (D-Ola.) of the Senate Agriculture Committee said he had received telegrams complaining that the President's plan to reduce the wheat content of bread will put 250,000 bakers "out of business."
But Thomas termed this "just one man's opinion" and added to a reporter: "I don't think anybody will be hurt by eating whole wheat bread for a while."

Will Rogers, Jr., Aims For Seat in U. S. Senate
BEVERLY HILLS, Calif., Feb. 8.—His Army service over, Will Rogers, Jr., son of the late famed humorist, is planning another excursion into politics.
He said yesterday he is candidate for the Democratic nomination for the junior senatorship from California. Incumbent is William F. Knowland, Republican appointed to fill the term of the late Frank Johnson.
Young Rogers was elected representative from the 16th District while he was in the Army, but resigned in 1943 to resume military service. Rep. Ellis E. Patterson, who succeeds Rogers in the House of Representatives, also is a candidate for the Democratic senatorial nomination.

Bail Fixed for Youth on Auto Stealing Charge
Bail for Ernest Eugene Hamilton, 18, was set at \$1,000 by Justice of the Peace Thomas C. Hartfield on the charge of larceny of an automobile. Hamilton was arrested in Ashland yesterday while in possession of a car he had allegedly stolen in Roseburg. "Two other guys," he told Hartfield, had offered him a ride in the car as far as Ashland. Hamilton demanded a preliminary hearing. The car was that of R. C. Gile, state legislator.
