Jesse Owens, an Olympic track champion, is "the world's fastest man." He has been making personal appearances throughout the nation since his return from the Olympic games at Berlin in 1936, in which he won four flat place medals and four records, the first time that any athlete had ever achieved that feat.

The team which Owens brings here tonight is all over six feet tall, with the exception of one player, Owens' men have had experience in college, semi-pro, and professional basketball as well as in other sports.

The Israelite House of David team, otherwise known as the City of David Bearded Aces, played here earlier in the year against a Roseburg Recreation team. The Davids are showmen and expert at juggling the ball. They combine skill with their comedy and should be a match for the colored boys.

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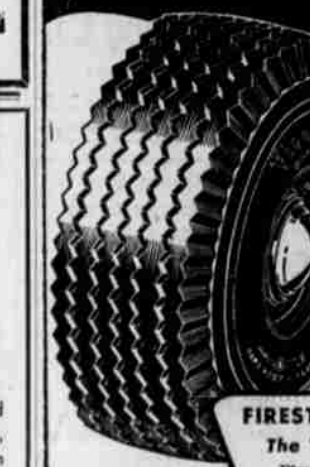


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
