

Kansas City Stars Defeat Whiskered Hoopsters, 47 to 46

It was standing room only last night, with spectators packed in the ceiling and extra bleachers put on the stage, when the Kansas City Stars defeated the House of David basketball squad 47 to 46, on the Roseburg High School floor.

The colored boys from Kansas City displayed some expert ball handling and the Bearded Aces had hardly a chance for the clowning that marked their earlier appearance here.

The Aces were handicapped by the loss of one of their players, Bob Hallisey, who in a hospital at Longview, Wash., as the result of a mishap on the Pacific highway near Kelso Monday, when a skidding passenger bus collided with the car in which they were riding. They had to borrow a player, Moore, from the Roseburg Recreation team last night. The Aces were still shaken and bruised from its accident.

The Davids led the first quarter scoring 10 to 2, but they were overtaken by the Stars, who maintained a lead for the rest of the game.

Owens In Exhibition
During half-time, Jesse Owens, the world's fastest human, demonstrated the techniques which brought to him four first place medals in track at the Olympic games in Germany in 1936. He gave slow motion demonstrations first, then a 30-yard dash the length of the gym. He also demonstrated his style in jumping hurdles. Owens told spectators that he had "always had a desire" to compete in the Olympic games, and was "very lucky to win."

Bishop Stars In Win Over U. of O.

EUGENE, Ore., Feb. 13.—(AP)—When Gale Bishop got back to Washington State College in mid-season, Basketball Coach Jack Priel was heard to remark that his boys would "have some fun now"—and last night they had it. They trimmed the University of Oregon's Northern Division champs 68 to 61 with Mr. B. bucketing 32 tallies.

Bishop might have beaten the circuit's one-game record of 34, held jointly by his teammates, Vince Hanson, and Don McMillan of Washington, had he not fouled himself out of the fracas with slightly less than four minutes of play remaining.

About all that W. S. C. accomplished by the victory was to tighten the race for third spot, still held by the losers, but the staters rose to within a game of fourth-place Washington. A repeat win tonight still would leave them in the league basement and fail to dislodge Oregon from third.

Bishop's goal pouring overshadowed two right good scoring performances by Bob Hamilton and Dick Wilkins, who had 17 each.

Dawson, Katonan To Headline Next Mat Card Here

A three-star professional wrestling program, including a headline grudge battle, was announced here today by Matchmaker Don Owen for his weekly mat show at the Roseburg Armory next Saturday night.

Samuel "Butch" Dawson, the rough-and-tough Alaskan, experienced rough going here last weekend. Although he defeated Angelo Martinelli in a short engagement, he suffered a defeat in a following team tussle against Martinelli and Al Szasz and with Paavo Katonan as a teammate. Dawson charged that he had little or no cooperation from the Finnish matman and challenged the coast light-heavyweight champion to a "fight to a finish."

Dawson wanted nothing barred, but the Roseburg Matchmaker frowned on the idea. They did, however, approve a "winner take all" proposal, which was also okayed by Katonan. The match

should be a knock-down and drag-out affair even without Katonan's title being at stake.

Marty Petroff, a villainous Russian newcomer from the Midwest, will be making his local debut in the 30-minute two-out-of-three-fall semi-final against Walter Tinkit Achin.

Al Szasz and Pierre LaBelle will engage in a 20-minute, one-fall opening match.

Former GI's Prefer to Begin Life in Australia

SYDNEY, Feb. 12.—(AP)—One hundred and fifty-two ex-U. S. servicemen arrived here today from San Francisco aboard a liner full of enthusiasm for jobs they said they would seek in Australia—and with an average of \$1,000 in their pockets to start life in this country.

They told newsmen that lower living costs and the more leisurely tempo of life had brought them to Australia. Most of the Americans had served on this continent during the war.
