International Worker Of Salvation Army Will Speaker Here Tonight



Lt. Colonel Agnes McKernan, above, former director of the women's prison bureau of the Salvation Army in New York City, on a speaking tour of the western states, will speak at the Roseburg Salvation Army Hall at 8 o'clock tonight.

A native of Ireland, Lt. Colonel McKernan, who has worked with women prison inmates in the United States since 1925, will tell of her work in these institutions. Prior to that time, Lt. Colonel McKernan's work with the Salvation Army took her throughout the British Isles, and to France during World War I. In 1935, Secretary of State Cordell Hull appointed Lt. Colonel McKernan a delegate to the penal congress in Berlin. She served as president of the National Prisoners' Aid Association for 1937 and was re-elected to the same office for 1943, the only woman to be so honored. She is a member of the League of Business and Professional Women and of the Federation of Women's Clubs.
