LEGAL NOTICE

Notice hereby given that the California Oregon Power Company, a California corporation, whose address is Medford, Oregon, has filed with the Hydroelectric Commission of Oregon an application for a license to appropriate water for the development of a power project (designated on the records of the Commission as Project No. 23 and by the applicant as the Toker Project) for the generation of a maximum of 42,500 electrical horsepower, said water to be appropriated from the waters of the State of Oregon in a stream known as the North Umpqua River, tributary of Umpqua River. It is proposed to divert a maximum of 350 cubic feet per second of such water at a point approximately 200 feet below the mouth of Clearwater River in the SE 1/4 of NE 1/4, Section 35, Township 33 South, Range 3 East, W. 1/2 in Douglas County, to a power plant 2,800 feet stream down and within the NW 1/4, SE 1/4, Section 27, Township 36 South, Range 3 East, W. 1/2. The applicant requests also a right to construct a dam with a maximum height of 45 feet to be located at the point where the water is to be diverted for use as a diversion dam and to store approximately 400 acre feet of water to be released as flood equipment stream flows of less than 400 cubic feet per second. A preliminary permit has heretofore been granted to the applicant herein by the Commission. NOW, THEREFORE, notice is hereby given to all persons that the Hydroelectric Commission of Oregon will hold a public hearing on said application for the license aforesaid, on the 10th day of April, 1946, at the hour of 2:30 P. M., at the office of the Commission in the city of Salem, Marion County, Oregon, to consider and to hear representations on behalf of the public or of any corporation or district organized for public purposes or of any other person or persons. All objections, protests or remonstrances to the granting of such license shall be made in writing in duplicate and based on the grounds set forth in title 11B, chapter 1, O.C.L.A., as amended, and filed with the secretary of the undersigned Commission at Salem, Oregon, on or before ten (10) days prior to the hearing on said application.
