Denazification to
Be Pressed Under
New U. S. Statute

BERLIN, March 6.—(AP)—Lt. Gen. Lucius Clay, deputy chief of the U. S. military government, announced yesterday a sweeping new denazification law placing in German hands more responsibility for purging the nation and indicating a commitment for Americans to remain in Germany at least 10 years.

Gen. Clay estimated that at least 1,000,000 and perhaps 4,000,000 of the 15,000,000 Germans in the American zone will be subject to punishment under the new law, which was drawn up by the three German provincial ministers-presidents in the zone and provides for trial of the cases by German courts.

The law specifies varying degrees of guilt for all Germans who aided Hitler, ranging from major offenders to minor cases classified as "followers." Major offenders are liable to as much as 10 years in a labor camp, confiscation of property and loss of all rights for a minimum of 10 years, including the right to own an automobile. The minimum sentence for major offenders is two years.

Gen. Clay said the American military government was determined to see that the sentences were carried out. Asked if this meant the Americans definitely intended to stay in Germany, he replied:

"As far as the military government can commit the United States, yes."

"Followers" of Hitler are subject to punishment by fines and the exacting of reparations.

Major offenders are defined as those who out of political motives committed crimes against victims or opponents of national socialism, were responsible for outrages, or gave major political, economic, propagandistic or other support to Nazi tyranny.

German industrialists and bankers, a large number of whom fall into the category of major offenders, comprise one group especially to be called to account. Many of these big businessmen are yet to be rounded up.

Katonan, LaBelle
Dated for Title Go

Roseburg has been awarded a much sought-after Pacific coast light-heavyweight championship wrestling match, according to an announcement made here today by Matchmaker Don Owen.

Paavo Katonan, the durable Finnish champion, will defend his coveted coast crown against the challenge of Pierre LaBelle at the Roseburg Armory Saturday night.

Owen has also scheduled an attractive preliminary mat match, bringing together Al Szasz, the popular Hungarian, against Bruno Angelo, the rough-and-tough Italian villain.

The Katonan-LaBelle match promises to be one of the greatest scientific mat classics in local ring history. Both are dynamic malmen who pack considerable punch despite their lack of villainous tactics.

LaBelle, the Frenchman who has been burning up the grappling circuit since his return from three years with the U. S. Navy, is given a good chance to upset the Finnish mat artist, who has held the coast title longer than most former titleholders.

Hunting Licenses Last
Year Reveal Huge Gain

WASHINGTON—(AP)—The 48 states collected \$15,512,252 from the sale of 8,190,901 hunting licenses in the year ended last June 30, compared with \$13,547,152 for 7,505,258 licenses in the preceding year.

Reporting this, the Fish and

Wildlife Service said the number of licenses issued last year set a record for the war period.

Despite travel restrictions and the rationing of gasoline and

tires, non-resident hunting licenses jumped from 107,886 in 1943-44 to 154,363 in 1944-45.

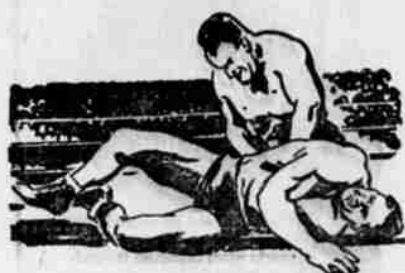

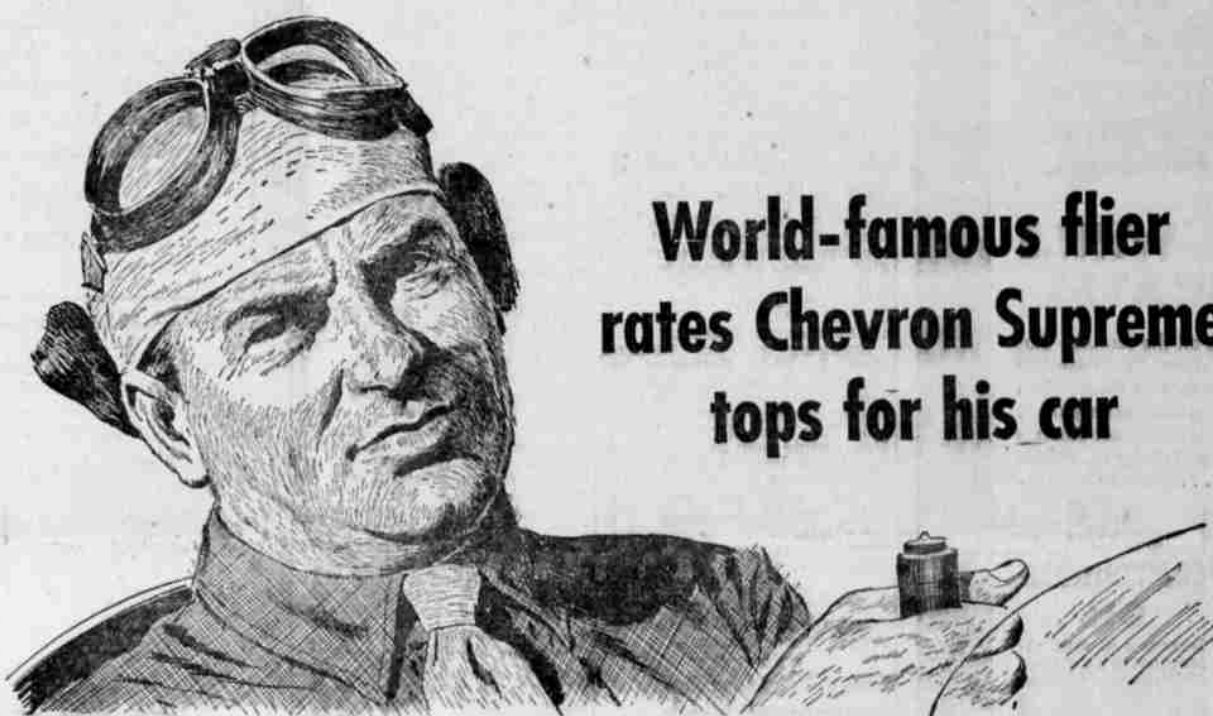
