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of protein for livestock. Recent action of the government requiring millers to extract 80 per cent of their wheat into flour as a means of saving wheat for the hungry abroad, has the effect of reducing mill feed output nearly a third.

The restrictions follow: Effective April 1, no person may legally buy or accept in any calendar quarter more than one sixth of the quantity of mill feeds he received during the calendar year 1945.

Effective March 1, no person may legally use during any month more than two thirds as much mill feeds in the manufacture of mixed livestock and poultry feeds as was used by him in the corresponding month of 1945.

Fugitive Trio, Police Engage in Gun Battle

OLYMPIA, Wash., March 7.—(AP)—City, county and state police alarms had citizens of several Western Washington towns hiding behind locked doors last night keeping out of range of stray bullets, as three desperadoes engaged in a running gun battle with the pursuing law.

Two of the men have been captured, an Olympia police officer, Jack Gustan, was slightly wounded as a bullet grazed his arm, and one of two stolen cars was smashed near Vancouver, Wash., after an 80 mile-an-hour chase from Olympia.

The thing began when a Chehalis farmer surprised some men trying to steal his tractor. They fired shots at him then fled in a machine bearing California license plates.

Car Found After Battle

Police, watching for the car, spotted it later in Olympia. As officers approached, men in the car opened fire and during the following exchange of shots, the gunmen raced away. Moments later, officers and the car abandoned with a bullet hole through the windshield. Inside and on the ground nearby, police found two revolvers, a rifle and a shotgun.

Shortly after, state patrolmen arrested a man trying to hitch a ride on the highway. State Police Sgt. J. D. Finnell said the man gave his name as Glenn R. Smith, 21. He was booked at Olympia on an open charge.

Meanwhile all highways were blocked between here and Portland and north to Tacoma.

Two Nabbed, 3rd Escapes

Approximately an hour later, five miles north of Vancouver, Wash., a speeding machine careened through a police block, raced away, sped through another at the Vancouver city limits. Seconds later, the vehicle crashed into three parked cars and was wrecked.

Two men were in the car, one was captured by police, injured. The other escaped. State Patrol Sgt. J. H. Williams said the injured man gave his name as Jack Roberts, 20. Early this morning the man was in a Vancouver hospital under heavy police guard.

Police said the gunman still at large escaped by dashing through the Vancouver High School yard. Williams reported Roberts said the man was armed with a revolver.

Sgt. Williams identified him as blond, 5 feet 11 inches, weighed 180 pounds, and was wearing blue trousers and a blue coat.

At least, that's the opinion of Roger Vergnes, New York City hair stylist, one of two featured stylists at the 22nd Midwest Beauty Trade show sponsored by the Chicago and Illinois Hairdressers Association.

Vergnes, a naturalized Frenchman who regularly styles hairdos for the Duchess of Windsor, Helen Hayes and Barbara Hutton, said in an interview that the natural wrinkles which, so annoyingly to most women, begin to show after that 30th birthday in reality give character to the face.

"Many mature women try to fluff up their hair kitchenshly so as to draw attention away from wrinkles," he said. "They look like cocker spaniels. The surest way to point up a wrinkle or skin blemish is to try to hide it. To me, a wrinkle merely emphasizes a woman's personality."

Vergnes added that he doesn't believe in fashion in coiffures. "Each coiffure should be individually adapted to the woman, to bring out the best in her features," he declared. "Suppose the current style in hairdresses is an upsweep coiffure. Not every woman who adopts an upsweep is going to look good. Many women just look silly trying to wear the current fashions."

tioned, the government was expected to intervene to delay the threatened nationwide strike of railroad workers in two big brotherhoods, scheduled for 6 A. M. Monday.

Nearly 300,000 members of the brotherhoods of Railroad Trainmen and Locomotive Engineers have been ordered to quit work starting Monday through Thursday. Presidents of the two rail unions did not predict whether Presidential appointment of an emergency board to consider the wage dispute would postpone the strike. The railway labor act provides such procedure, which would delay any strike from 30 to 60 days while the board studies the strike dispute.

At the brotherhood headquarters in Cleveland, however, officials went ahead with detailed preparations for the walkout. Plans call for halting of service on 112 railroads on Monday, on 85 Tuesday, 91 on Wednesday and 96 on Thursday.

But Alvanley Johnston, president of the trainmen, said yesterday that "any action taken by the government would be considered because we have always bowed in respect to the power of government. He added, "we do not know what the government will do."

Truman Gets Detroit Plea

Negotiations in the General Motors strike remained deadlocked as the Detroit city council appealed to President Truman to intervene in an attempt to end the 167-day work stoppage. There appeared no hope of an early settlement and Federal Mediator James F. Dewey went to Washington to report to Secretary of Labor Schwelb.

No other major developments were reported on the labor front as some 800,000 remained idle because of continuing labor disputes.
