Timber Access Roads Urged by Rep. Ellsworth

WASHINGTON, March 14.—(AP)—Access roads into the great timber areas of government lands in the Pacific Northwest would help increase the production of lumber, Rep. Ellsworth of Oregon told the House during debate on the Agriculture Department appropriation bill. He said the bottleneck in production of lumber is a serious shortage of logs. "The shortage of logs, I am informed," Ellsworth said, "is partly due to the inaccessibility of the federally-owned timber which could be made accessible by additional forest roads and trails or access roads."

Army to Speed Discharge Of 47,000 Officers

WASHINGTON, March 14.—(AP)—The War Department announced today it intended to speed the discharge of more than 47,000 officers. Under instructions sent to all commands, most officers with two years service as of next August 31 will be released by that date provided they wish to return to civil life. Exceptions are regular, medical corps officers, those who volunteer to remain longer in service, and officers in certain scarce categories.

Missing Trapper's Body, Overturned Boat Found

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., March 14.—(AP)—A body identified as the remains of Ed Parker, 32, a trapper, was found yesterday washed up on the shore of Agency Lake, 25 miles north of here. Parker had been missing since early Tuesday when he left to run his trap line. He was using a boat, and the craft is believed to have overturned in ice which is breaking up along the sides of the lake. The capsize boat was sighted by an aviator.

Bill Would Slay Bowles' Power to Fix Trade Margin

WASHINGTON, March 14.—(AP)—Senator Elmer Thomas (D., Okla.) today introduced legislation to take away from Stabilization Director Bowles any authority to fix margin requirements for traders on commodity exchanges.

The chairman of the Agriculture Committee offered his bill after telling reporters that legislators should "pool their efforts" to prevent extension of OPA after June 30, its present expiration date.

Thomas acted as OPA prepared to take unprecedented action with respect to margins designed to nip rising cotton clothing prices. Meanwhile, the government ordered garment producers to hustle to market their supplies of scarce shirts, suits, trousers, underwear and women's stockings, both nylon and rayon. And a Civilian Production Administration official reported an

agreement which he said will "substantially increase" output of rayon hosiery, now almost as hard to find as nylons.

Ex-Aide of Hitler and Wife Commit Suicide

BAD TOELZ, Germany, March 14.—(AP)—Adolf Hitler's "geopolitical" theorist, Prof. Karl von Haushofer, 76, and his 69-year-old wife took their own lives Sunday near their home at Hartshimmel, it was learned here today.

Both took poison, authorities said, but Mrs. Haushofer was found hanging from a tree, while the professor lay face down on the ground.

The bodies were discovered by the couple's son, Heinz, who also found two glasses containing traces of poison, officials said, adding the couple had left a note indicating a suicide pact.
