Treason Charged to 6 Filipino Puppets

MANILA, March 15.—(AP)—Joseph Laurel, president of the puppet Philippine republic, and five members of his Japanese-sponsored cabinet were indicted on charges of treason yesterday. Topping a long list of others charged with collaboration as commonwealth prosecutors worked at topside to complete filling more than 4,000 cases before Monday's deadline were:

Jorge B. Vargas, the late Philippine President Manuel Quezon's secretary who became chairman of the Japanese-controlled executive commission and later was puppet ambassador to Japan; Tio of Philippine President Sergio Osmeña's sons by his first

than the eight already named, still are under investigation. Prior Loyalty Admitted

"Some witnesses holding strategic positions have made the significant statement, under oath, that they had a loyalty which took priority over the loyalty owed by them to their own country and, for that reason, they acted as they did and would have continued so to act had they not been detected," the commission said.

Today's Royal Commission report on the general charges made public March 4, giving "spy thriller" details of operations under pseudonyms. The earlier report said the military attaché of the Soviet embassy had sought to obtain secrets of the atomic bomb, radar, electronics and the whereabouts of numerous United States military units.

Other Guilties Named

In addition to Boyer, the commission named these:

Harold Samuel Gerson, assistant to the head of the production control department of Allied War Supplies, Ltd. A government company concerned with the production of chemicals and explosives. Gerson was known in the spy ring under the cover name of "Gray," the report said. Squadron Leader Matt Simons Nightingale, employed as a tele-

phone technician in the construction of military airports by the Royal Canadian Airforce.

Dr. David Shugar, a PHR in physics at McGill University, who was employed in the Navy on research in anti-submarine detection. He used the undercover name of "Prometheus," the commission reported.

More Acreage Added to Tree Farms Systems

PORTLAND, Ore., March 15.—(AP)—Eleven Washington and Oregon forest properties totaling 93,365 acres have been added to the America Tree Farms System, the joint committee on forest conservation reported yesterday.

The committee, representing the West Coast Lumbermen's and the Pacific Northwest Loggers' Associations, said the two largest units accepted for membership were the Crown Zellerbach Corporation's 51,700-acre tree farm in Columbia county, Oregon, and the Milwaukee Railroad's 41,160-acre Milwaukee-Cowlitz tree farm in Lewis county, Washington.
