Ten Roseburg Boys Will Attend Beaver Boy State Meeting

Ten Roseburg boys, yet to be chosen, will go to the Beaver Boy State at Oregon State College this summer. Erwin Short, a state director of the American Legion-sponsored project, announced today. The summer camp, which will instruct boys from all over the state in the procedures of government and politics, will be divided into six "counties" and 12 "cities." The boys will elect their own "government" for the week-long period of their attendance at the camp.

The camp will start June 30 and last until July 7, or will begin July 7, and end July 14, Short said.

Erwin Jahn, Portland, is state chairman of the Beavers Boy State; Eugene Springer of Roseburg is local chairman. Earl Britton of Eugene, a member of Roseburg's Umpqua Post, No. 16, American Legion, will be camp director this year. He will be assisted by Bill Harper, Corvallis, officer of the day; Dr. Waldo Hall, Corvallis, medical officer; Ralph Coleman, Corvallis, recreation director; and Professor J. Lloyd LeMaster, instructor in geology.

Waste Paper Price Guarantee Secured

Definite arrangements have been made with a large mill to take waste paper collected in Roseburg April 27 at a guaranteed price. It was reported today by Paul Elliott, member of the committee in charge of the waste paper campaign.

The paper collection will be made for the benefit of the Roseburg Recreation program, which will receive all net proceeds. If the drive is as successful as in the past, it will net the program from \$400 to \$500 under the terms guaranteed by the paper mill to which the sale will be made. It is expected to load out 40,000 pounds or more.

All residents of the Roseburg vicinity are urged by the committee to save all waste paper. Newspapers and magazines should be bundled separately, tied securely into packages from 12 to 18 inches in height. Loose paper should be packed tightly into cardboard cartons, which, in turn, should be tied with strong cord.

Detailed instructions for placing bundles or cartons for collection will be announced by the committee at a later date.
