The power on what is known as the North Douglas Electric Cooperative and the lines purchased from the California Oregon Power Company, which serves the following territories: Yencalla, Drain, Anlauf, Elkton, Scottsburg, Umpqua and vicinities, and districts East of Oakland and Sutherlin, will be off from 8:30 A. M. until 12:30 noon March 31, 1946, due to changes that are taking place to increase the capacity of the system.
