PLEASURE BOAT OWNERS

Application forms for licenses for pleasure boats may be secured from the office of the county clerk in Roseburg, or from Sherman Smiley or W. G. Benson at Reedsport.

All pleasure boats over 16 feet in length are required to be licensed. The license fee is \$5.00 per calendar year for boats over 16 feet and not over 20 feet in length. For boats over 20 feet add \$1.00 for each foot over 20. Boats 16 feet and under are not required to be licensed. This applies to all pleasure boats irrespective of motive power.
