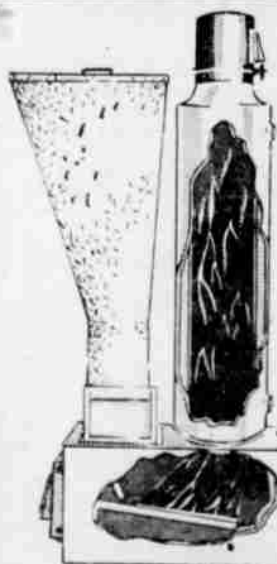

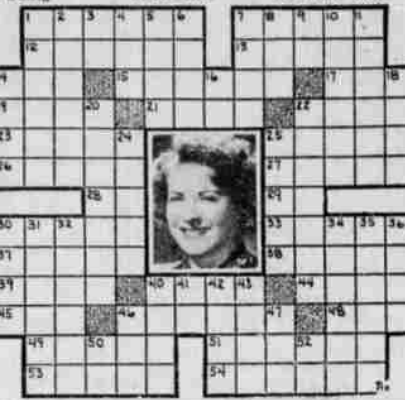

Incorporation Voted By Citizens of Sisters

REDMOND, April 10.—(AP)—Oregon boasted a new city today—the town of Sisters. Results of yesterday's election, held in an all-day snowstorm, showed voters 115 to 61 in favor of incorporation. The town, 22 miles west of here, has 389 registered voters. A first attempt at incorporation was made several years ago, but failed because of fear of increased taxes and livestock restrictions.
