

Better Use Urged Of Forest Products

Better utilization of forest products is the aim of the Pacific Northwest Forest and Range Experiment Station in Portland. Yesterday, two researchers from the laboratory who were visitors in Roseburg, at the offices of the Umpqua National Forest, told of two forest by-products, both large consumers of low-cost wood, which can be developed in this area.

A yeast, high in protein content, is derived from wood alcohol and wood sugars, said E. E. Matson, one of the researchers. Primary sources here, he said, would be sawmill and logging waste.

No more research is necessary to develop the yeast, he said. No manufacturing plants in the United States produce it yet, but all that is necessary now is the establishment of semi-commercial plants for initial production. There exists in Oregon and Washington a ready market for at least 100,000 tons now supplied by cotton seeds and other sources. The yeast would be mixed with cattle and poultry feed.

"If we move fast enough," said Matson, "we may be able to relieve the critical shortage in poultry and livestock feeds."

Development of another by-product utilizing the waste from sawmills and logging operations, would be the manufacture of charcoal which would supply a large

industrial and recreational market. Charcoal is used extensively as a fuel for electro-metallurgical and electric furnaces. In a recreational way, it is used for barbecue pits and outdoor fireplaces.

Manufacture of charcoal here would necessitate a commodity rate on the railroad, Matson said. Coos Bay has an advantage over Roseburg because of its cheap water transportation. There is only one charcoal plant in the Pacific Northwest now, he said, located at Auburn, Wash.

Matson and E. G. Locke, also of the Forest Service laboratory at Portland, were to be taken yesterday by M. M. Nelson, supervisor of the Umpqua National Forest, to the Western Battery Separator plant to inspect another phase of wood utilization.
