there were believed to be no prominent German scientists in Spain, although there were enough technicians to form a "bothersome nucleus" for research.

Regardless of what disposition the Security Council eventually makes of the Polish charges, the coming discussion seemed certain to contribute to the pressure-campaign undertaken by the allies to force a bloodless change of rule in Spain, wartime spy post and supply source for Germany and Italy.

The present threatened crisis finds Franco and his Spanish government with hardly a friend ready to champion their cause or ideology in the court of world opinion.
