National Forest Timber for Sale

Sealed bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, Umpqua National Forest, Roseburg, Ore., on up to 2:00 P. M., May 17, 1946, for all the live timber marked or designated for cutting on an area embracing about 4000 acres within Sections 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 33, 34, 35, and 36 of T. 26 S., R. 5 E. (Unsurveyed). Sections 19, 30, and 31 of T. 26 S., R. 6 E. (Unsurveyed). Sections 2 and 3 of T. 27 S., R. 5 E. (Surveyed). Willamette Meridian, Umpqua National Forest, estimated to be 120,000 lineal feet of lodgepole pine poles less than 30 feet in length, 1,920,000 lineal feet of lodgepole pine poles 30 to 35 feet in length, 360,000 lineal feet of lodgepole pine poles 36 to 45 feet in length, a total of 2,400,000 lineal feet and an unestimated amount of lodgepole pine poles over 45 feet in length. No bids of less than the following minimum prices will be considered: Poles under 30 feet in length, \$0.005 per lineal foot; poles 30 to 35 feet in length, \$0.008 per lineal foot; poles 36 to 45 feet in length, \$0.013 per lineal foot; poles over 45 feet in length, \$0.018 per lineal foot. In addition to the prices bid for stumage, \$0.0025 per lineal foot for all live poles must be deposited into the Treasury of the United States as part of a special fund for paying the cost of the disposal of slash. In addition to prices paid for stumage and slash disposal deposits at rates above specified, \$0.0025 per lineal foot for the total cut of live poles must be deposited into the Treasury of the United States to cover the cost of maintenance of those portions of the North Umpqua and Cascade Lakes Forest Roads which may be used in the transportation of poles from the sale area. A deposit of \$4,000.00 must accompany each bid, to be applied on the purchase price refunded, or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to the conditions of the sale. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Before bids are submitted, full information regarding the timber, conditions of sale, and the submission of bids should be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Roseburg, Oregon.
