

Sheep Shearers Union Faces Fight

SAN FRANCISCO, Calif., April 16.—(AP)—No more lambs will be slaughtered in California after Saturday unless negotiations are initiated to terminate a current sheep-shearing labor dispute. Milton Maxwell, president of the AFL Western Federation of Butchers, announced yesterday.

He said the five-day notice was served on the California Sheep Growers Association by all 37 local unions.

Maxwell asserted Glenn County growers had locked out all union sheep shearers, "notifying them that they can't come back to work until they tear up their union cards. Back of this is a threat of the California Sheep Growers to bring in non-union labor from outside the state to handle this year's clip. And all because we are asking a measly two and a half cents more per sheep for shearing, bringing the overall wage to 22 cents per animal."

"We don't want to hurt the public, but the very existence of our affiliated sheep shearers' unions are at stake."

Contempt Proceedings Voted Against Seventeen

WASHINGTON, April 16.—(AP)—The House today adopted a resolution approving contempt proceedings against 17 persons.

The action, which does not require Senate concurrence, was requested by the House committee on un-American activities. The resolution said the individuals displayed "wilful and deliberate refusal to supply subpoenaed records."

The 17 include Miss Helen R. Bryan, executive secretary of the joint anti-Fascist refugee committee of New York, and 16 members of the organization's executive board.

Spain Fears Russian Invasion Via France

LONDON, April 16.—(AP)—The Madrid radio expressed fear that Russia was planning to invade Spain as the Franco government awaited replies today from five "friendly" nations invited to send technicians to investigate charges that Spain is a threat to world peace.

These charges, together with an assertion that Spain was harboring German scientists, were made by Oscar Lange, the Polish delegate to the United Nations Security

Price Boosts Granted Makers of Jams, Jellies

WASHINGTON, April 16.—(AP)—OPA today granted a price increase to the makers of jams, jellies, apple butter and fruit preserves to cover a half cent a pound rise in sugar prices authorized Feb. 10.

Retail prices may go up slightly as a result, OPA said. The one-pound jar of jam or jelly, for instance, may go up about one cent. OPA said the higher cost of sugar means an increase to jam and jelly producers of about one and one-half to two per cent in processing costs.

3,000 Construction Jobs Halted by Govt. Agency

WASHINGTON, April 16.—(AP)—The civilian production administration said today it has halted more than 3,000 construction jobs begun in violation of the three-week old building limitation order.

Remedy Tried on Rats Destroys Tumors, Cancers

PHILADELPHIA, April 16.—(AP)—Three Philadelphia scientists report developments of an alcoholic extract which destroys tumors and cancers and sets up immunity against the growths in inbred albino rats. They disclosed their experiments in a paper written for the Journal of Immunology.

Dr. Paul Myron Aptekman, chemist at the Wistar Institute of Anatomy and Biology, produced the alcoholic extract. He was aided by Dr. Margaret Reed Lewis, research expert on cancer, and Dr. Helen Dean King, who inbred the rats for the experiments.

The extract has been tested successfully only on the rats and is not ready for use on humans, the scientists said.

Sweet Decision

CHICAGO, April 17.—(AP)—Mrs. Josephine Stoeckel, 42, was awarded a half pound of butter and nine pounds of sugar by Superior Judge Edwin A. Robson.

Her husband, Herman, 44,
