It was on Easter morning, 1917, during the World War I, twenty-eight American boys were to go over the top at daybreak. The chaplain rose early and held a communion service, at which all partook. The chaplain read, "This is my body which is broken for you." Then he took the chalice and read, "This is the blood of my new covenant, which was shed for you. Drink it in remembrance of me." With their lips still moist, these lads went over the top. At the close of the combat only six returned. The others had poured out the sweet red wine of youth for their country. When all was quiet again, the chaplain went out into the battle zone. He found them all. They were lying still in death. Some with upturned faces. They seemed to say, "This is my body which was broken for America. This is my blood which was shed, that the ideals of freedom might live. They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old. Age shall not weary them nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning, We will remember them." The cross is central in the life of all individuals who would be truly Christian. Fathers and mothers who now suffer through the agonies brought on by war know something of the sufferings of God in the agony of His only begotten Son, Jesus Christ.

Wimberly for breaking the conditions of an earlier parole. Kissinger and Collins also returned Cecil Meyers from the penitentiary where he is serving five years, to face an indictment of larceny in a dwelling returned

by the grand jury in February. Deputy Sheriffs Dick Baker and Al Smith went to Reedsport Wednesday to take three juveniles from there back to the Fairview Home at Salem, from which they had escaped.

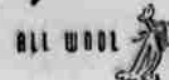
