

Martinelli Loses To Angelo; Dusette Defeats Johnson

In a continuation of their wrestling feud as headlines of the weekly card at the Roseburg Armory Saturday night, Bruno Angelo and Tony Martinelli each got a fall, but a decision automatically went to Bruno when his fellow Italian failed to appear for the scheduled third round. In the second round, lasting 8 minutes, 22 seconds, a hammerlock and a leg stomp easily finished Tony after his noggin had been bashed against a ring post in a duel of corner-to-corner slugging, plus sundry other tactics forbidden in the book of rules. Upon quitting the mat, Tony collapsed in front of the

ringsiders and was carried, insensible, to the dressing room on the shoulders of Referee Owen. He was still "out" at the end of the rest period, and that ended the night's hostilities. Tony annexed the first fall in 20:33 with a surfboard hold after using hand-chops to the neck to fall Bruno. He clamped a similar hold on his foe in the second round, but Bruno averted defeat by squirming off the mat, to the accompaniment of jeers from the nearly 600 spectators. Dusette Beats Johnson. Georges Dusette, the muscle marvel, returning here after an absence of several months, again displayed the prowess of his crushing full nelson hold in the semi-final, the victim being Gust Johnson. By resorting to neck slugging, Johnson got his more powerful antagonist in a position for a surfboard hold and won the first fall in 25:32. Dusette got revenge in the second stanza in

12:17, catching Gust in his nelson hold, applying it with such terrific and prolonged pressure that he left Johnson writhing on the mat, and unable, because of a strained neck tendon, to straighten his head. He was assisted to the dressing room by the referee, and it was expected that he would not return for further combat. After an extra five-minute rest, Johnson came back, however, but he lasted just 45 seconds. Dusette quickly bent him to his knees with a series of neck swats, then again clamped on the nelson hold and it was good night for the game but out-muscled Johnson.

Detroit's Tigers Defeat Cleveland To Shatter Jinx

(By the Associated Press) Detroit's Tigers, having smashed a triple jinx that plagued them through the years, were licking their chops today and shouting defiance at the baseball experts who had predicted the wartime world champions would not repeat.

Prior to this season the Tigers had (1) lost their last eight opening games; (2) beaten Pitcher Steve Gromek of Cleveland only once in seven tries; (3) taken the measure of Bob Feller but twice in his last nine starts against them, or since rookie Giebell confounded the baseball world by outpitching the Indians' fireballer in a game which decided the 1940 pennant.

This year, in only five days, Detroit's darlings have (1) shattered their opening day hoodoo by beating the St. Louis Browns in the season's inaugural; (2) whipped Gromek 7-0 in his own ballparks; (3) triumphed over Feller, who before this season had beaten the Tigers more times than any other team.

The net result is that the Tigers have won four of their first five games and are breathing hotly on the necks of first place Boston's also once-beaten Red Sox in the early season pennant race. The Sox have won one more game than the Bengals.

Game Won in 10th. Detroit had to travel into over-time yesterday to break the Feller jinx. The Tigers accomplished it in the 10th inning, 3-2, when Lake wrangled a free pass and scumpered all the way home on a two-bagger by Mayo. Feller had allowed only four singles up to that time but was held on

even terms by Detroit's Overmire and Trucks, who took over in the seventh and got credit for the victory.

The Red Sox had to be satisfied with an even break against Philadelphia's Athletics, and were forced to stage a six-run ninth inning rally to even gain that. After Metkovich's three-run homer climaxed the ninth inning onslaught, Ted Williams won the opener in the 10th with a bases-loaded single 12-11. The A's behind old Bobo Newsum, gunning for his second straight victory, captured the second game 3-0 to snap Boston's five-game winning streak.

Homer Wins for Yanks. The New York Yankees, pre-season favorites for the American League flag, kept pace with the Red Sox and Tigers by tripping Washington's Senators 6-1 behind the effective six-hit pitching of Chandler. DiMaggio and Keller made Chandler's quest for his second straight triumph easier by hitting successive homers in the seventh frame.

The revenge-minded St. Louis Cardinals fought back from a three-run sixth inning deficit to defeat the National League champion Chicago Cubs 7-6. Victory sent the Cards into a tie for first place with Brooklyn. The defeat dropped the Cubs into third place.

Other Results. Brooklyn continued to feast on its cousins, the New York Giants, defeating their interborough rivals for the third straight time 2-1 as rookie Joe Hatten outpitched Voiselle for his first major league victory.

The Cincinnati Reds ended a victory famine by submerging the Pittsburgh Pirates in both ends of a double header 8-2 and 4-3. Boston's Braves and Philadelphia's Phils divided a twin bill, the Braves winning the opener on a squeeze bunt in the 11th 3-2 and the Phils, aided by McCor-

mick's two-run homer, taking the nightcap 3-1. Despite two four-hit jobs by Chicago White Sox pitchers, the St. Louis Browns took both games 2-1 and 4-2.

Fallin's 0-0 Pitching Defeats U. of Oregon

SALEM, Ore., April 22.—(P)—Righthander Lee Fallin pitched a no-hit-no-run game here Saturday at the Salem Senators of the Western International League defeated the University of Oregon, 7-0, in the seven-inning nightcap of a doubleheader. The Senators also won the opener, 9-4. Fallin walked three men.

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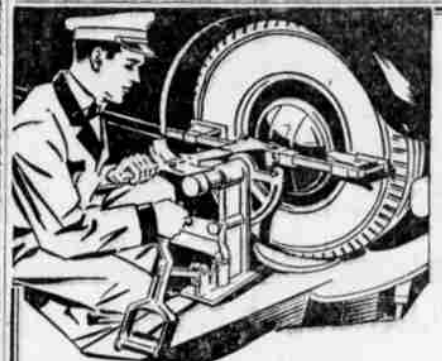
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
