

Scarsella Hitting At Pace That Bids For League's Top

First Baseman Les Scarsella of the Oakland A's has his history working belatedly for a blast-bid to repeat as the champion batter of the Pacific Coast League.

Top hitter of 1944, Scarsella coasted along on a single homer and a single now and then for nearly a month this season.

But in the seven-game series with Los Angeles last week, he served notice he may be the batter to beat, batting in 12 runs on 10 hits, half of them homers, and averaging .435 in 23 opportunities at the plate.

He came home eight times for a total of 20 runs scored and batted in. The opposition scored 30 runs in all.

Scarsella hit .329 to pace the batsmen in 1944. In 156 games that season he hit 196 times, for the most safeties of the season.

Manager Stengel, who previously had Scarsella under his wing at Boston in the National League in 1940, believes the 30-year-old veteran is on his way.

The coast clubs idled yesterday. Today the bats of Scarsella and his mates attack the Stars at Hollywood, while Los Angeles, in third place behind Oakland, takes on the leaders of the league at San Francisco. The pace-setting Seals have a three-game edge over the Oaks.

Seattle plays Portland at the latter club's park in the first meeting this season of the two northern teams, and San Diego invades Sacramento.

Larkin Defeats Joyce to Annex Welterweight Title

BOSTON, April 30.—(AP)—Taking a leaf from the pages of its books of the golden twenties, boxing today had a new junior welterweight champion—a betwixt-and-between division that thrives only in its days of prosperity—in Tippy Larkin of Carlisle, N. J.

Larkin survived three knock-downs under the iron-fisted punching of Willie Joyce only to go on, thanks to fleet foot-work and expert left-fabbing, to crown himself as the first post-war junior welterweight titlist by gaining an unanimous 12-round decision in bruising fashion last night at the Garden.

Those battles were engaged in a return match, after almost a year's lapse, and Joyce had much the best of it during the early stages. In their previous clash Joyce, while battling from a stand-up stance, was defeated by a decided margin.

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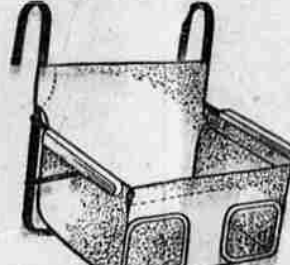
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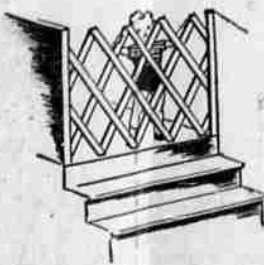
