Mrs. Patrick lost her first husband in 1933 and was left with six children to care for. She married Mr. Patrick in 1936 and in 1940, he suffered a serious illness and so the burden of caring for the children was her's again.

She had four sons in service; three in the Navy and one in the Merchant Marines and all four received honors. Charles, chief pharmacist mate; Harry, pharmacist mate; Leo, who was aboard one of the large battleships when it went down and was in the water 24 hours before being rescued; and Richard, who made many trips in both the Pacific and Atlantic. The four boys have all received honorable discharges and are now working. Three of the boys are married and Charles has a son, only grandchild of Mrs. Patrick.

She has been employed for eight years as a seamstress at the Veterans hospital in Roseburg.
