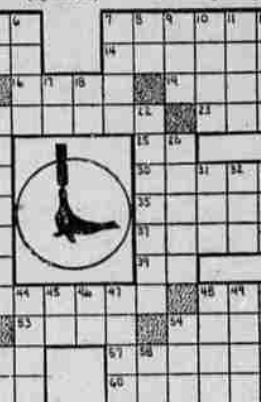

Prints Photos Directly on Wall



Photo murals can now be printed directly on a wall, just as you would make a print on a piece of paper. Scientists at the Glenn L. Martin Company's Baltimore Laboratory perfected a jelly-like emulsion which, when melted, may be applied to the wall surface with a brush, sponge or rag. When it dries, the negative is held against this sensitized surface, light is applied and development of the picture proceeds normally. The entire operation is carried out under darkroom conditions, with ruby light. Above, an operator is making a print on a wall.

Grade Pupils Stage Protest Against Defeat of Budget

GRANTS PASS, Ore., May 3.—(AP)—Sixty pupils of the seventh and eighth grades at Jerome Prairie School staged a protest demonstration yesterday for the Josephine County School District taxpayers' defeat Tuesday of the proposed 1946-47 budget and bond issue.

Classes opened with only two students in the rooms. A petition signed by the students who walked out was given to Hershel Mannan, principal, and later in the morning a written statement outlining the reasons for the walkout was read by two of the eighth grade boys to County School Superintendent L. C. Moffitt at his office in Grants Pass.

Following is the statement: "We, the students, are staying at home for two days in protest for the failure to pass the budget. Here are our reasons:

"1. Our new building cannot be finished.
"2. No transportation.
"3. No hot lunch program.
"4. No playground equipment.
"5. We protest against spending another year in the community hall with outdoor toilets, poor heating, poor lighting, no full partitions between rooms and the dangers of crossing the highway."

Moffitt indicated that his office is powerless to compel the students to attend school. He said that under the state compulsory attendance law, the pupils are reported to the attendance officer after they have been absent three days.
