U. S. Asks 15 Nations to Disband Buying Missions

WASHINGTON, May 4.—(AP)—The State Department announced today it had asked 15 nations to disband their purchasing missions in this country and get back to normal peacetime trading practices as soon as possible.

Representatives of several of the nations have replied that their missions are being reduced and will be eliminated by the end of this year.

The American aim, the State Department said, is to get international trade back into private commercial channels as soon as

possible.
