Music in worship services will mark the opening Sunday in churches all over the country with ministers, organists and choir collaborating to honor the place of music in religion and in the home.

Local Music Week committees usually include non-musical organizations as well as those directly concerned with music and they will concentrate this year

on the extension of the community music program. More attention than during the war years will be given to the development of vocal and instrumental groups, civic and industrial choruses and the social use of the musical skills of young people trained in the public schools.

The General Federation of Women's Clubs is urging its 16,500 member groups to participate and approve the project as an opportunity for different groups in the community to share their common interest in the most universally loved of all the arts. The message points out that bringing before the public the best music of all nations promotes the growth of that spirit of brotherhood among peoples without which there can be no lasting peace.
