Southern Pacific Not Affected by Coal Tie-Up

Passenger train service on Southern Pacific rails will not be affected by the coal strike situation, since Southern Pacific uses oil over its entire system from Portland to New Orleans. It was announced here yesterday by J. E. Clark, local agent for the line.

A telegram received in Roseburg yesterday said that as far as beyond Southern Pacific lines is concerned, connecting railroads will continue operation of the principal through trains to Chicago and St. Louis which Southern Pacific operates from the coast, and eastern roads between New York and Chicago will continue operation of their leading trains.

Operation of second sections or principal trains by some connecting lines and eastern lines will be curtailed, resulting in some decrease in passenger carrying capacity. Train reservations should be made in advance if possible, Clark said.

Mrs. Amiot, accompanied by Mrs. E. J. Loney, Sutherlin, spent Tuesday in Drain, Oakland, Yoncalla and Sutherlin making arrangements for the people of those communities to take advantage of the free x-ray service available when the unit is in Douglas County.

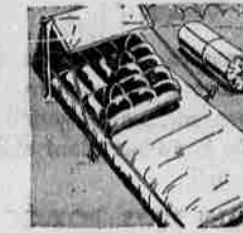

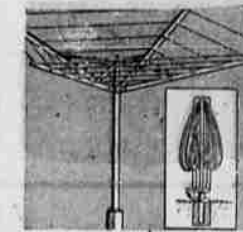
