

Milk House Plans Call for Approval; Herd Test Required

Dairymen who either are building or contemplate building milk houses may save themselves time and money by ascertaining that such construction and equipment meet state requirements for the grade of milk they sell. Such plans may be submitted for approval or suggestions to Hans Seltors of North Bend, who is the representative of the State Department of Agriculture, division of foods and dairies for Coos, Curry and Douglas counties. Or they may be sent direct to the department headquarters at Salem.

State regulations require certain types of materials as well as construction. Materials going into construction of milk houses should be moisture proof. On this point, Seltors says, pumice building blocks are not impervious to moisture unless they are plastered with cement or otherwise treated so they will not be too absorbent.

Herd Tests Required

Mr. Seltors says also that he was advised while in Salem recently to attend a division conference in connection with the new fluid milk regulations that the department is now receiving from those in charge of federal testing for Bang's disease up-to-the-minute reports on location of reactors. As a result, the division is now in a position for the first time to enforce that portion of the so-called pasteurization law relating to raw milk sold in bottles.

Briefly, this law requires that in herds where reactors are found, the herd be tested at intervals of 15 to 21 days for four tests. If reactors are found and removed after each test, and no reactors found on the fourth test, the herd will be disease-free. If, however, on the fourth test, Bang's disease reactors are found again, as far as the sale of raw milk is concerned, the milk must be pasteurized if sold in the bottle and can trade. It does not apply to dairies producing raw milk for pasteurization, as milk which is pasteurized eliminates any danger of undulant fever, which is the human form of Bang's disease.

6 Held in Slaying of 2 GIs Riding With Woman

NUERNBERG, May 13.—(AP)—Six German civilians, all men, have been arrested by military police for clues in the fatal shooting of two American soldiers in a jeep last Friday night.

Military police who searched a four-square mile sector found small quantities of American rounds and cigarets in German homes.

The identity of the two victims, both members of the Stars and Stripes Army newspaper staff, have not yet been released.

One high ranking officer told newsmen he was not convinced any German was implicated in the slaying of the two men, who were shot while riding in a jeep with another soldier and three young women.

Summer School at OSC to Be Limited To 1,400 4-H'ers

Oregon's 1946 4-H Club summer school, to be held at Oregon State College June 18 to 28, will be somewhat larger than a year ago but still will be limited to about 1,400 boys and girls, according to H. C. Seymour, state 4-H Club leader.

This will compare with about 1,100 who attended last year's school and a peak pre-war enrollment of around 2,200. Housing facilities have improved slightly this year to permit a small increase in numbers.

This year's session will be the 31st for Oregon club members. Started in 1914, these schools have been held every year since except 1944 when Army students stationed on the campus occupied practically all available housing.

The Oregon club school is unique among all those held in the United States, being the only one that extends for as long as 10 days and likewise having the largest attendance of club boys and girls of any similar school in the nation in normal years.

County quotas have been established again this year on the basis of the ratio of club members completing their projects. Members winning school scholarships in state and county competition will be given first preference and scholarship winners in community contests will be considered next, Seymour says. Any vacancies remaining in county quotas may be filled by those paying their own way.

Supplementing the staff of several score regular O.S.C. faculty members who will instruct the youngsters in classrooms and laboratories will be a number of nationally-known specialists, according to Seymour. These will include L. M. Vaughn, chief of the labor utilization division of the federal extension service; Kenneth Ingvalson, western states field representative for the extension service; T. A. Erickson, formerly state 4-H leader in Minnesota for many years; and several representatives of national firms interested in club work.

Increased emphasis will be given this year to discussion groups for older club members and to courses in keeping with new developments along farm and home interests, such as frozen foods and labor utilization.

Doubts Tidal Wave From Atomic Bomb

SEATTLE, May 13.—(AP)—A University of Washington physicist said Saturday he doubted if a tidal wave would result from the Bikini atom bomb test, and hedged his opinion with this remark:

"Of course you can't hold me responsible for this prediction. If I'm wrong I won't be coming home at all."

(The professor, Joseph E. Henderson, director of the university's applied physics laboratory, will be a member of the "Operation Crossroads" expedition.)

"We all are taking out extraordinary insurance," Henderson said, "but I expect to return from Bikini alive and I don't expect to find my waterfront home here engulfed."

Prof. Henderson said he based his doubts of a tidal wave result from the bomb test on a comparison of the comparative energies involved in the test and in the recent tidal waves.

He said he believed the bomb would cause a wave of some magnitude but that it would fall off rapidly.

between the foreign service officers—career men who are the backbone of the American diplomatic system—and comparative newcomers to the field of diplomacy.

The fight has been intensified in part by Byrnes' problem at Paris of trying to work out with the Russians, British and French satisfactory peace settlements for Europe. On the central problem of how to deal with Foreign Minister Molotov and the Russians, Byrnes received two strikingly different recommendations.

His regular political-diplomatic advisers under Assistant Secretary James Dunn recommended that he stand firm on every Russian demand considered to represent an expansion of Russian powers into western Europe. These advisers wanted the conference fought out on such issues as Trieste and Tripoli—tactically recognizing that eastern Europe is Russian and western Europe is not.

Follows Own Advisers

Byrnes' non-professional advisers under Acheson and Clayton—

notably experts on European economy—argued this was likely to create instead of resolve international conflicts. They drew an elaborate memorandum recommending that Byrnes try first to unify Europe by seeking Anglo-Russian agreement to some means of tackling such European-wide economic problems as transportation. After that, they said, should come the work on political issues.

Byrnes, however, took a staff of veteran diplomats to Paris with him, and reports from the conference show that in the main he followed their advice.

Yet his proposal of a 25-year, Big-Four treaty of alliance against Germany was regarded by the other side as an outgrowth of their advice but not substitute for it.

This is the third time in the past few weeks that Acheson has been identified with a project which not go through. He called for much more drastic food control and famine relief measures, only to have President Truman say a few days later that he did not know of any more drastic measures he could take.
