

Douglas Posse to Take Part in Rose Festival Parade

PORTLAND, Ore., May 16.—Ten Oregon mounted posses will participate in the first all-state posse exhibition ever staged in the United States at the 38th annual Portland Rose Festival June 2-9, with Betty Willis, celebrated Northwest trick rider, as featured performer.

The line-up for the big night show in Multnomah civic stadium June 6—more than 250 riders and prize horses—includes the Oregon mounted posse of Salem, Portland mounted posse and sheriff's posses from Klamath, Jackson, Lake, Douglas, Lane, Yamhill, Clackamas and Washington counties. All posses also will be in the grand floral parade June 7.

Members of the 10 posses are all law enforcement officers who carry on their posse activities as a hobby. They go in for prize horses and ornate silver-mounted saddles, some of which cost as much as \$5,000 each. Total estimated value of horses, saddles and bridles which will appear at the Rose Festival is between \$350,000 and \$400,000.

Each posse will present its own spectacular brand of high-speed action in mass formations and intricate drills. Several special features also are planned to round out the night show. Special lighting effects will add to the colorful exhibition.

Illegitimate Babies Now On 'Black Market' List

SPOKANE, May 16.—(P)—A well-established "black market" in illegitimate babies is being operated in Spokane and other northwest cities, often for private profit, Salvation Army officials declared here yesterday.

Major Orilla Hirst, superintendent of the Salvation Army women's home and hospital, said that 3 to 4 percent of all live births are illegitimate. She estimated that 47 percent of the adoptions of illegitimate children are handled through individuals rather than through public agencies.

House Refuses Money For Transmission Line

WASHINGTON, May 16.—(P)—The House refused yesterday to permit the spending of \$2,000,000 for transmission line construction in California's central valley.

It rejected by a voice vote an amendment to the Interior Department appropriations bill to make the money available. The amendment would have authorized the Reclamation Bureau to use the \$2,000,000 for the construction of a second power line from Shasta and Keswick dams to Tracy, Calif., for operation of irrigation pumps and sale to municipalities and other consumers.

101 Wild West Ranch Circus Billed in Roseburg May 25

Spring is here. The first crocuses are in bloom and the first circus press agent has come and gone, leaving behind glowing tales of the 101 Ranch Wild West Show and International Congress of Circus stars which is coming to Roseburg Saturday, May 25, for two performances at Garden Valley Road and Walnut Street.

World's champion cowboys and cowgirls, Indians from five tribes, trick riders and fancy ropers vie with top notch circus acts for honours in the big frontier show.

The Indians simulate raids on the settlers, burn the covered wagons and generally make themselves a nuisance; old time western bad men hold up the Ponca City-Deadwood stage coach in a realistic manner, while horse thieves come to a fitting end dangling on a cowpoke's lariat.

All this the press agent has promised, plus more than a score of big-name circus acts headed by Mark Smith, his motion picture fighting horse, "Wildfire," and an all-girl riding revue. Other acts featured are Maurice Marmalejo, king of the slack wire; the Cutler troupe of aerialists; Toni Madison and her wild west "dogies"; Landon's Lilliputians and Maj. Bob Thornton's military ponies.

Hundreds of horses, trained wild animals, elephants, pretty girls and funny clowns round out the show, which also carries a big Indian village and menagerie.

Reserved seats will be on sale circus day at Roy's, while children's part-paid tickets will be available at no cost at any Mobilgas station.

NOTICE TO LIQUOR DEALERS

The legislature of the State of Oregon in its 1945 laws, Chapter 90 thereof, provides as follows: "It shall be unlawful for any person to sell for consumption on the premises any alcoholic liquor as defined in Section 24-103 O.C.L.A. during the time the polls are open on any day on which an election is held throughout the State."

Section 11 of this Chapter fixes a fine or imprisonment or both on conviction for violation of the provisions of the Act.

Chapter 24-103 O.C.L.A. provides that the words "alcoholic liquor" means any alcoholic beverage containing more than (1) of (1) percent of alcohol by volume and every liquid or solid patented or not containing alcohol and capable of being consumed by a human being.
