

Cardinals Defeat Brooklyn, Grab Top Position in League

(By the Associated Press)
With Lefty Howie Pollet holding Brooklyn to five scattered singles, the St. Louis Cardinals shaded the Brooklyn Dodgers 1-0 yesterday to displace the Flatbush favorites as the National League leaders.

The sweep of the two-game series with the Dodgers put the Cards 11 percentage points ahead of the Brooks.

The Boston Red Sox dropped their second game in the last 19 and their fifth in 28 games this season when they bowed to the Chicago White Sox 3-2, but did not lose any of their five and a half game cushion, as the second place New York Yankees also were beaten, 8-2, by the St. Louis Braves.

Cleveland came up with some Grade-A pitching to rain a double shutout over the Athletics 3-0 and 5-0.

The Chicago Cubs whipped the Philadelphia Phils 6-4 in a 13-inning endurance contest.

Another fine pitching exhibition by Joe Beggs, who notched his fourth triumph without a defeat, enabled Cincinnati's rising Reds to edge out the New York Giants 2-1 in a 10-inning thriller.
