

## Hens Slaughtered In Feed Shortage

SEATTLE, May 21.—(AP)—Fred N. Hunt, Washington Cooperative Egg and Poultry Association branch manager, today estimated that Washington poultry farmers are slaughtering laying hens at the rate of 30,000 to 40,000 a day because of the grain feed shortage. He said the association alone is dressing 20,000 a day. "These are all good laying hens—over and above our regular young stock receipts," Hunt added. He said the poultry market had declined about 2 cents a pound and "there is grave danger

it will fall to pieces." Some buyers are paying but 16 cents, live-weight, but the averages are 18 and 19. J. G. Wilson, manager of the Pacific Northwest Feed Association, whose members were besieged by poultrymen today for emergency rations, told interviewers that "the U. S. Department of Agriculture has not kept faith with the poultry and livestock industry of this state. For a period of five weeks, we have been promised immediate grain, but not once has the government made good on these promises. "It's about time the officials gave us something definite. If they are going to sink us, then why don't they tell us, so the poultry and livestock men will

not pour any more money down the drain trying to hold on." **Navy Fund Recommended** WASHINGTON, May 21.—(AP)—The House Appropriations Committee today recommended \$4,639,650,000 for the Navy next year in response to Secretary Forrestal's plea for a "truly effective sea and naval air power" to help keep the peace.

## Yank Identifies Nazi Who Started Bulge Slaughter

DACHAU, Germany, May 21.—(AP)—A grim Kentucky soldier pointed today at a Nazi SS trooper and accused him of starting the Malmédy massacre of 71 unarmed American prisoners of war by wantonly firing at them with his pistol. Lt. Virgil P. Lary, Jr., of Winchester, testifying in the trial of 74 SS veterans in the Dachau war crimes court, was one of six Americans who survived the butchery at the Belgian town of Malmédy during the winter battle of the Ardennes bulge 17 months ago. That was Germany's last offensive.

Lary climaxed his dramatic story by identifying Georg Fleps, 23, of the First Waffen SS panzer regiment, as the killer. The prosecution charges that the Germans slaughtered nearly 800 American prisoners of war during the Ardennes offensive, allowed the first panzer regiment to hunt in human beings for sport and issued "no prisoner" orders. "We were standing in the field at Malmédy crossroads, 150 to 175 of us, unarmed with our hands clasped over our heads," Lary testified. "I saw no wounded men. They were all American. Two vehicles drove up and parked on our flank and I saw a German place a machinegun over the side of one. Then another vehicle drove up and stopped between the other two. I saw a man take his pistol and aim in the direction of our group.

He fired two shots from a distance of 15 yards. "At the first, I saw an American with his hands clasped over his head go down. I did not see the effect of the second shot." Asked to identify the slayer, Lary walked across the court to the section seating the 74 SS defendants. He looked into the face of each. In the last row, his gaze fastened on Fleps. "This is the man who fired the two shots into the field on December 17, 1944," Lary said.

## Strassen Urges Ouster of 2 Top Federal Executives

CHICAGO, May 21.—(AP)—Removal of the secretaries of labor and commerce and the stabilization director was urged by Harold E. Strassen, former governor of Minnesota, as "men having major responsibility in the failure of the administration" to meet the emergency problems of reconstruction.

In an address to the Inland Daily Press Association, Strassen, a Republican, urged President Truman "to promptly call a major economic conference consisting of representatives of the major economic groups, of the best of the nations' economists, and of the leadership of both parties. "I urge that the economic conference recommend the basis in which the entire economy can be promptly adjusted to the new level now irrevocably created by the 181 cent steel formula, and present the plain-spoken basis for holding the line at that new level."

## Man Hospitalized After Tractor Runs Over Him

Albert L. Hall was reported in "fine" condition at Mercy Hospital this morning, where he is recovering from bone, leg, and shoulder injuries received last week on the V. T. Jackson ranch near Winchester. Hall was caught under the rubber-tired tractor which he was operating. His cries for help brought residents from across the river, who called an ambulance from Roseburg. Most of the citizens of Saskatchewan, Canada, have been settled there since 1910.

## 'Mac' Bans 2 From Cabinet of Japan

TOKYO, May 22.—(AP)—General MacArthur today laid down a firm "no exceptions" policy on potential Japanese political purges—and out went two nominees for Premier Yoshida's new cabinet.

Yoshida, however, made quick changes in his portfolio to accommodate the sudden development. There was every expectation that he would seek final approval of the emperor at once. The Japanese government formally requested MacArthur to exempt Justice Minister Iwata and Nasu, nominated for agriculture minister. His directive bars individuals with militaristic or ultranationalistic records from public office.

Headquarters turned down the request, ruling there would be "no exceptions." The action was seen as doubly significant. Iwata had been allowed to serve as justice minister in retiring Premier Shidehara's cabinet, presumably under special dispensation. Japanese sources had explained that he was indispensable as a foremost legal authority in drafting the country's proposed new constitution. The Japanese foreign liaison office said it regarded both Nasu

and Iwata as ineligible, but hoped to win MacArthur's waiver because Yoshida especially wanted Nasu.
