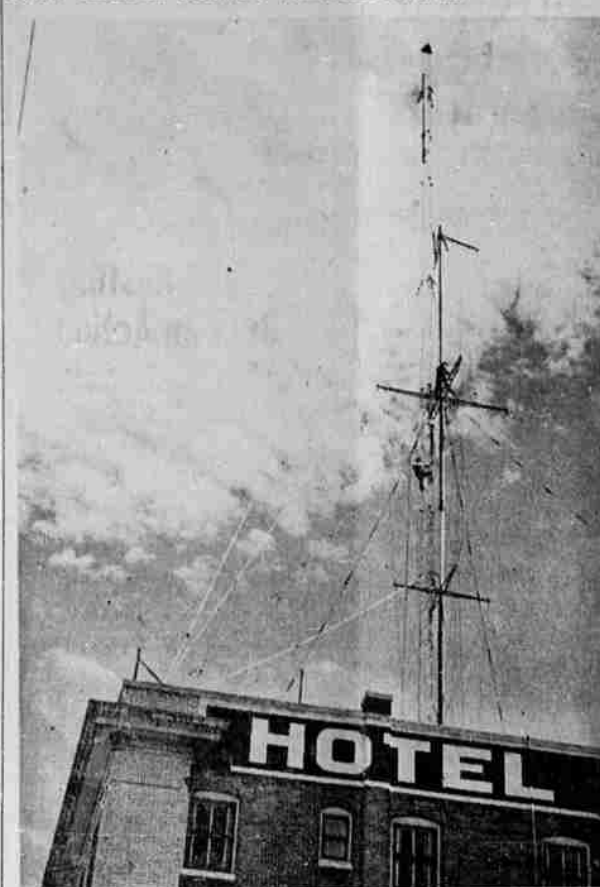

New Aerial Serves Station KRNR

I SAW radio station KRNR's new aerial being placed in position atop the five-story Umpqua hotel. Of uniform crossmember construction, it replaces the old tubular mast, which is the picture above is shown as it is being cut into lengths and lowered.

Rising 150 feet above the roof of the hotel, the new tower affords better broadcasting facilities and at the same time is more wind resistant. Equipped with lights at three levels, with a flash arrangement at the peak, it will constitute something of a landmark for Roseburg as well.

Installation is being made by the Towers Sales and Erecting Company of Portland, with C. E. Sutherland in charge. Recently this company installed the tower for KFLW, the Herald and News radio station in Klamath Falls.

"It now seems clear," Bowles declared, "that there is little chance of obtaining congressional approval for additional subsidy funds to protect consumers against these food price increases."

He added that subsidy cuts already voted by the House and by the Senate Banking Committee "will require further sharp in-

creases in the prices of milk, butter and cheese after July 1."

He estimated these might jump the total increase to two cents a quart on milk, 18 cents a pound for butter and eight or nine cents a pound for cheese.
