

Beaver Boy State Has Openings for More Applicants

Several vacancies exist in the local quota for the American Legion-sponsored "Beaver Boy State," June 30 to July 17 at Oregon State College, Eugene V. Springer, local chairman, announced today.

Fifteen boys will be sent by the Umpqua Post No. 16 to participate in the annual camp which is organized as a state government in miniature. Boys attending will elect their own governor, legislators, mayors, and other officials. In addition, there will be an organized athletic program and classes in civics and community responsibilities.

Earl Britton, juvenile advisor of Lane County, will act as camp director, with Bill Harper, OSC campus police chief, acting as officer of the day. Ralph Coleman, of Lucky Beavers pitching staff, fame, will be in charge of athletics at the camp. Included in the list of instructors will be Prof. LeMaster, teaching geo-politics, and Aubrey Tussing, who will instruct in the subject of government.

Included in the program will be talks by special speakers on phases of government including city, county, and state and the election of various boys to fill offices in the three governmental branches. In addition to the lectures and athletics, the program will also include the editing of a daily newspaper, and radio programs.

Only three Roseburg boys have signed up for the camp, Springer said. Scholarships have been offered by local civic and fraternal groups, and there will be no expense to boys who attend. Their transportation will be paid from Roseburg.

All boys who are interested, should contact Mr. Springer at the Douglas County Creamery, any day after 5 o'clock, he said.

Home Service Is Missioners' Plan

A home service mission under sponsorship of the Presbyterian Board of National Missions, in and around Roseburg, was begun this week by the Rev. Benjamin S. Bollman, who was released last year from the Los Banos internment camp, 40 miles from Manila, after he and Mrs. Bollman had been held prisoner during the war by the Japanese.

The Bollmans spent 13 years in the Philippines as missionaries under the Presbyterian Board of Foreign Missions. He was pastor of the United Evangelical Church (representing the combined missionary effort of the Presbyterian, Congregationalist, and United Brethren Churches in the Philippines) at Los Banos, where the agricultural college of the University of the Philippines is situated.

Prisoners at Los Banos were liberated by MacArthur's forces during May, 1945.

In Roseburg, the Rev. Mr. Bollman will work in the city and in surrounding communities. The Bollmans have found a home in

West Roseburg, not far from the Veterans' Facility.

Rev. Mr. Bollman will be the Sunday evening speaker at the First Presbyterian Church, the Rev. Morris H. Roach, pastor, announced. A reception for the Bollmans will be held following the service.

The words red tape, denoting official inaction or delay, originated in England in the 19th century when legal and official documents were tied in a pinkish tape.

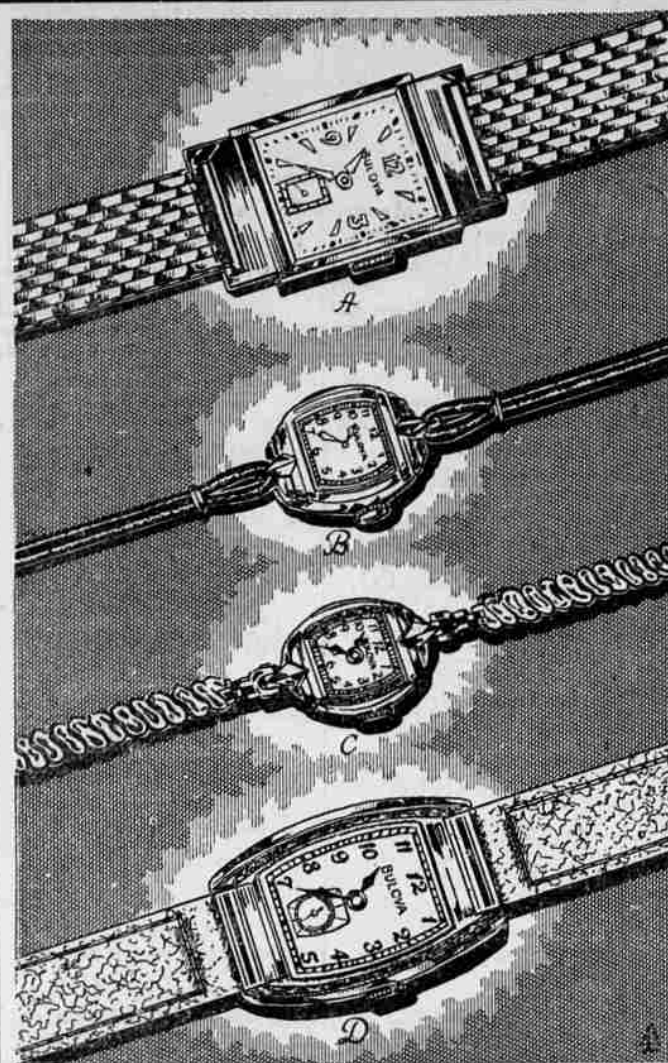
