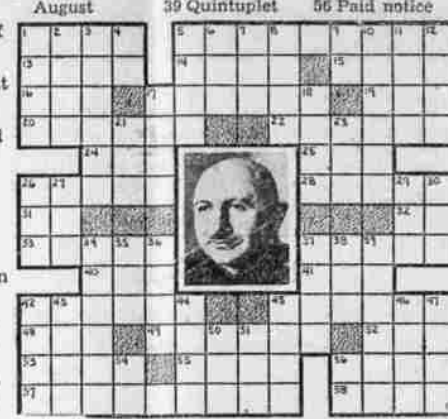

Bulb Demonstration Dated at Scottsburg

Demonstration meeting by R. Ralph Clark, extension horticulturist of Oregon State College, will be held in the field at the Harry Burton farm at Scottsburg, Friday afternoon, June 14. The meeting will be under sponsorship of the Umpqua Valley Bulb Growers Association. Spraying, fertilizing and irrigation methods will be pointed out.

Estranged Wife Victim Of Brutal Murder

PHILADELPHIA, June 8.—(AP)—Apparently strangled after a vicious beating, the nude body of an attractive red-haired woman was found early today in a second floor apartment.

A 46-year-old painter who led police to the death scene identified the victim as Mrs. Mary Duffy, 48. He said she had been estranged from her husband. Investigators held the painter for questioning without charge.

The woman's jaw was broken, her face badly battered and her cheeks cut. There were marks about the throat and the letters "A" and "L" had been branded on her stomach, possibly with acid.

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Water Mains Being Laid in Reedsport

REEDSPORT—Reedsport's new \$15,000 water mains in the downtown district, are being laid by Warner Brothers of Eugene, who were awarded a contract for the job recently.

Superintendent J. A. Hancock, in charge of the operations, has a large crew of men and a large mechanical ditch digger at work. Ditching and the laying of new pipe on H and 13th Streets have been completed, and work is now progressing on the alley between G and H Streets.

Charles Clark, local water and street commissioner, is inspecting the new work for the water department, and laying out a new central parking strip on Rainbow Plaza, a 100-foot wide street. The Reedsport City Planning Commission recommended to the city recently, that all parking on L Street between 13th and 15th Streets, which is a state highway, be discontinued and that all parking between L and H Street on 14th Street be discontinued, so additional parking must be supplied on Rainbow Plaza.
