No bid of less than \$4.10 per M feet for Douglas-fir No. 2 saw-logs and better grades, \$1.70 per M feet for white fir, \$6.80 per M feet for western white pine, \$3.55 per M feet for western red cedar, \$1.70 per M feet for western hemlock, \$1.30 per M feet for Douglas-fir No. 3 saw-logs, \$6.80 per M feet for sugar pine, \$1.55 per M feet for California incense-cedar, and \$1.70 per M feet for other species will be considered. In addition to the prices bid for stumpage a cooperative deposit of \$0.20 per M feet B.M. to be used by the

Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, a cooperative deposit of \$0.15 per M feet B.M., to cover the cost of tree planting, seed sowing and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over, for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement, will be required. Bids with rates in excess of those permissible under MPR 460 will be reduced to the allowable maximum in making the award. In event of receipt of more than one bid at the maximum permissible price, award will be made in such manner as in the awarding officer's judgment will result in a maximum contribution of materials needed for the reversion and housing program. Where two or more such tie bidders are equally qualified in this respect in the awarding officer's judgment, award will be made by lot among them. \$5,000.00 must accompany each bid, to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to the conditions of sale.
