However, Senator Brooks R. Ill., himself a conservative in international dealings, said: "This is another evidence that the states do not want outside interference in the election of their representatives in the U. S. Congress."

Grissold conceded defeat when only about 8 per cent of the 2,032 precincts had reported. Butler's

margin remained about 2 to 1 as counting proceeded.

On the Democratic senatorial ticket State Senator John Mekota, endorsed by his party's state convention, won over George Olsen, former bus boy who was nominated for governor in 1942.

Self-Appointees Defeated

The Idaho Democratic senatorial contest was enlivened by the raising of a "self-appointment" issue against incumbent Gossett, who resigned the governorship last November and took the appointment to succeed the late Senator John Thomas, a Republican.

Taylor campaigned actively for Donart, declaring Gossett was a

member of the party's "reactionary element."

Rep. Henry Dworshak, veteran of four terms in the house, won the Republican senatorial nomination easily. Richard H. Wells, Pocahontas merchant, was second. Gov. Arnold Williams, Gossett's Democratic successor in the state house, and Dr. C. A. Robins, Republican, won the gubernatorial nominations.

favor tying in the Case proposal with Mr. Truman's emergency strike control measure, which is awaiting House Rules Committee action after passing both chambers in varying form. It provides for government seizure of essential strike-bound plants and would require union leaders to take affirmative action to get their members back to work.

Key Republicans are opposed to this rider strategy at present, however. They told reporters it would give the President a chance to veto both plans, and thus win favor of labor generally.

Many influential GOP lawmakers said they would just as soon do nothing more of this session, and then blame the President for any future labor discord which may develop.

"We gave the President a bill which would do a great deal to curb industrial strife and he killed it, so what more can we do?" Rep. Allen (R-Ill.) asserted in a typical comment.

Interior Chief Slated For Portland Confabs

PORTLAND, June 12.—(AP)—Secretary of the Interior J. A. Krug, on a tour of the west, will arrive in Portland tomorrow for two days of conferences.

He will address a meeting of Interior Department employees that night and on Friday will meet with representatives of various groups, including the grange, farmers' union, farm bureau, Pacific Northwest Development Association, Columbia Valley Trades Council of the AFL, Oregon-California Land Grant Administration, fishing and flood control representatives and the Portland Chamber of Commerce.

Neuner ruled, however, that the Board of Aeronautics should prescribe the nature of the courses to be taught, so that the courses may conform to regulations of the board.

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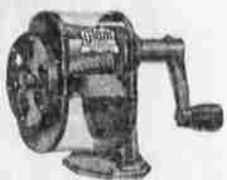
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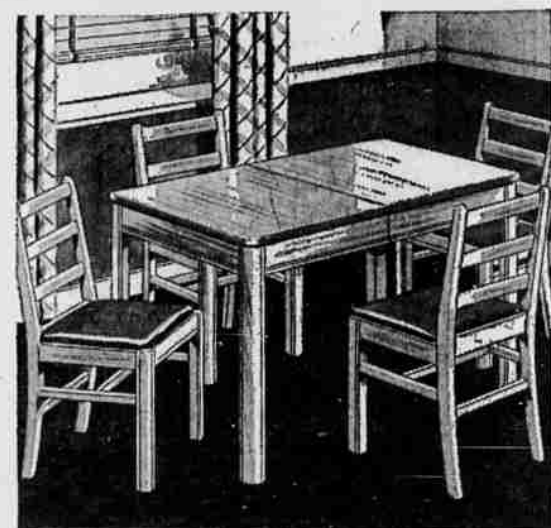
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
