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Careful Driving During Rodeo Urged

Presence of horses on streets and roads in and near Roseburg during Rodeo Week demands extreme driving care on the part of motorists. Sheriff O. T. Carter said today, Sheriff Carter urges all motorists, as a matter of protection to themselves, horses and riders, to reduce speed when approaching or passing horses.

"Many of the horses used by local riders as well as those of rodeo performers are young and have not become accustomed to motor traffic," Carter said. "Many are high-spirited animals and are apt to sidestep directly into the path of a moving car. Drivers should approach horses cautiously and be prepared to stop quickly should the animal get out of control temporarily."

Striking a horse with an automobile can cause much damage to the machine and its occupants as well as producing almost sure injury to the horse and its rider. We urge motorists to be extremely careful during the next few days.

Lonely Life Causes Vet To Commit Suicide

SEATTLE, June 19.—(AP)—Coroner John P. Brill, Jr., said that John B. Johanson, 44, artist and war veteran, took a running dive through the open window of his fourth-floor apartment and plunged to his death early yesterday, dependent over a lonely existence. Johanson was discharged from the 13th tank battalion because of age.

Max Bride, manager of the apartment house, told Brill that Johanson attempted suicide a year ago by jumping from a moving train and other tenants who had attempted to befriend him said the artist complained of being "very lonely." They said he called a woman's name as he lay dying in the alley below his window.

Two Germans Nabbed in China as Spies for Japs

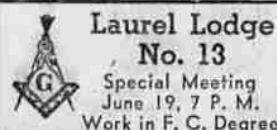
SHANGHAI, June 18.—(AP)—Two Germans accused of violating Germany's surrender terms by spying for the Japanese in North China have been arrested in Peiping, U. S. Army headquarters announced today.

The announcement said they planted secret agents in Manchuria, parts of Mongolia and in the wartime Chinese capital of Chungking itself, and had 24 radio operators and code men intercepting Army communications of forces of the United Nations.

Spotted Fever Fatal to Oregon Lumberman

LAKEVIEW, Ore., June 19.—(AP)—Rocky Mountain spotted fever was fatal Monday to George A. Stephenson, 70, widely known Lakeview lumberman.

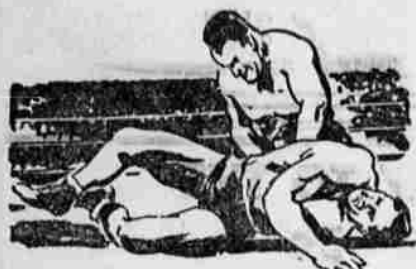
