

Grillmen Down Oilers; Taverners Romp Over Elks

Last night's doubleheader softball games spelled walloping final scores for the two victors, but hard-played games for all four teams.

An error-studded overtime eighth inning gave the Rainbow Grillmen a 19-13 victory over Associated Oilers, and the Pastime Taverners of Sutherlin breezed over the formerly second-place Elks, 16-6 in the second contest.

Going into the eighth inning with 13 runs apiece, the Grillers took advantage of Oilers' pitcher, Walton, to the tune of six runs, dampening the high spirit upheld by Associated throughout the first seven frames, and showing them defeat by six runs.

Outstanding for the Grill was the speedball pitcher maintained by Ralph Sanders, who relieved Hopkins in the third bracket. His tally came to 10 strikeouts. Sensational fielding and fly-snatching tabbed Art Stephens of the Oilers with attention for the evening.

A 15-hit attack by the Pastime Tavern club and 11 strike-outs by Tavern hurler Swede Vang steam-rolled over the Elks.

Leading 6-3 at the top of the fourth, the Sutherliners began a series of bingles which continued through Over's homer with the bases full in the seventh. The Elks, trailing 6 to 1 in the third, and 11-6 in the fifth, failed to threaten the spirited Pastimers.

Life Insurance May Be Renewed By War Veterans

Veterans who have allowed their National Service life insurance to lapse may have it reinstated without physical examination if their health is as good as on the day the policy lapsed, according to an announcement by the Veterans' Administration.

In most cases the veteran's own statement of good health is enough to have the policy reinstated.

Five-year policies, issued before January 1, 1946, may now be retained until eight years from the time it was taken out at the same rate as was paid in the service. At any time within that eight years it may be converted to a permanent plan.

Policies issued since January 1 are good for five years from the date of issue, and may be converted within that time.

Regardless of the length of the lapse, payment of only two monthly premiums on the amount to be reinstated is enough to resume the policy.
