Catholic Church Checks Leftward Trend in Europe

LONDON—(AP)—The militant influence of the Catholic Church is countering western Europe's postwar trend to the left, and four successive elections have won its adherents political plurality in democratic governments.

Belgium, Holland, France and Italy demonstrated, in rapid succession, the strength of Catholic leadership. In each election, Catholic parties emerged as the strongest political unit. Catholic-sponsored parties also led in recent elections in Austria, southern Germany and Luxembourg.

It is no secret campaign. On the eve of the recent French and Italian elections, Pope Pius XII appealed for electors to vote "in the Christian way." When Catholic candidates led the tickets, the Vatican newspaper, L'Osservatore Romano, expressed hope that the results would prove "an efficacious counsel to other countries."

In Holland, previously, Catholic party leaders had declared: "For us, the bishops' wishes are enough."

The upswing of Catholic parties in each country, welding divergent viewpoints into religious unity, is regarded as significant by continental leaders who express apprehension of communism.

How, Where to Use DDT Described in Garden Circulars

Have you too been puzzled over which of the scores and scores of DDT concoctions now on the market to buy for garden, household or livestock use?

Then two experiment station circulars of information just arrived at Oregon State College will help straighten out the matter.

One is "DDT Products and Precautions in their Use," by R. H. Robinson, agricultural chemist, while the other is "Suggestions on the Use of DDT for Vegetable Garden Pest Control." Both are available free from county extension offices.

The first of these, after stating that there are now more than 150 different brands of DDT products on the Oregon market, explains the different forms and their best uses.

DDT products are now sold as wettable powders for sprays, dusts, DDT-in-oil products, and DDT aerosol bombs. All of these have their special uses and some may be used more or less interchangeably while others cannot.

Precautions Necessary
The circular also stresses the fact that DDT is not in the category of deadly poisons such as must be labeled with skull and crossbones, but that simple precautions are necessary.

The other circular lists all the common garden vegetables with their principal pests and tells whether DDT will control them or not. Dusting powder of 3 per cent strength is the most useful in the garden, states the author, Dr. Don C. Mote, head of the entomology department. Five per cent strength is used for squash bugs and similar plant bugs.

DDT is particularly effective with the 11 spotted cucumber beetles, the circular shows, a pest heretofore resistant to nearly all insecticides. It is also good for most species of grasshoppers, beetles, cabbage worms, squash bugs, carrot rust fly, pea weevil and some others. On many other pests experimental evidence is still lacking or inconclusive. Gardeners are cautioned not to use it on edible parts of vegetables.
