Andrews, Thomas Newland and W. F. Flook. The tablet was placed on the church by Rev. S. A. Danford, district superintendent for the Church Conference Historical Society. W. H. Rummell was pastor of the church in 1925. An all-day celebration was held and addresses were given by Rev. Mr. Danford and Rev. Joseph Knott. The club is having the tablet mentioned repainted in addition to making a number of repairs to the church. Miss Margaret Page, of Roseburg, who is greatly interested in this work, has very kindly tendered a generous donation toward the fund.
