Warfare Fog Machine to Be Foe of Farm Insects

Promising preliminary results from applying insecticides by means of a warfare fog-making machine are reported on in a new O. S. C. experiment station circular of information, "A Progress Report on the Agricultural Tests With the Besler Aerosol Generator." A research project on this subject is carried on in cooperation with the manufacturer of this machine.

Tests were begun late last season with one type of this machine and are continuing this season with a later model believed better adapted for agricultural work. Tests made last year on such crops as hops and corn were inconclusive but promising. Used around canneries, barns, restaurants and households to control flies and other pests, spectacular results were obtained, lasting at least two months. A hop pickers' camp ground was also cleared of

flies and mosquitoes, report H. E. Morrison and W. B. Rasmussen of the entomology staff.
