

Five Labor Union Chiefs Scored By Spanish War Vets

SALEM, Ore., June 27.—(AP)—A resolution demanding that all labor unions be incorporated under federal law was voted yesterday at the closing session of the 38th annual encampment of the Oregon Department of the United Spanish War Veterans.

The delegates, asking other veterans organizations to join them in a petition to Congress for incorporation of labor unions, condemned five labor leaders whose unions were involved in recent strikes or strike threats.

They are John L. Lewis of the United Mine Workers, A. F. Whitney of the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen, Alvanley Johnson of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers, Joseph Curran of the National Maritime Union, and Harry Bridges of the CIO Longshoremen.

Another resolution asked that Governor Snell, when and if the United States employment service is returned to the states, to integrate the service closely with the State Department of Veterans Affairs.

Corvallis was chosen as the site for the 1947 encampment, with

the date to be set later.

F. W. Humphreys, Oregon City, who was elected state commander today without opposition, was chosen delegate to the USWV national encampment in Milwaukee. In the only contested race, Alfred L. Harriman won by three votes over Carl Thompson for state inspector. Both are from Portland.

Other new officers are F. M. Rich, Portland, senior vice commander, and John Simmons, Klamath Falls, junior vice commander.

New officers of the auxiliary are Zidonia Quick, Portland, state president; Austria Barneberg, Klamath Falls, senior vice president, and Lena Veach, Eugene, junior vice president.

New officers of the Military Order of the Sergeant, fun-making branch of the organization, are J. D. Carleton, Portland, grand Gu Gu grandissimo; Bob Carter, Azalea, grand datto; Mark Rolfsen, Portland; Erick Anderson, Newport; Guy Lewis, Newport; Frank Pliska, Albany, slick and slimy keepers of the ophi-dian.

The delegates refused to approve a resolution for increase of Spanish War pensions because the question is being studied by the national organization. They approved a resolution asking Congress to order the Navy to recon-dition the old battleship Oregon and return it to its berth in the Willamette river in Portland.

Fines Levied on Batch Of Traffic Violators

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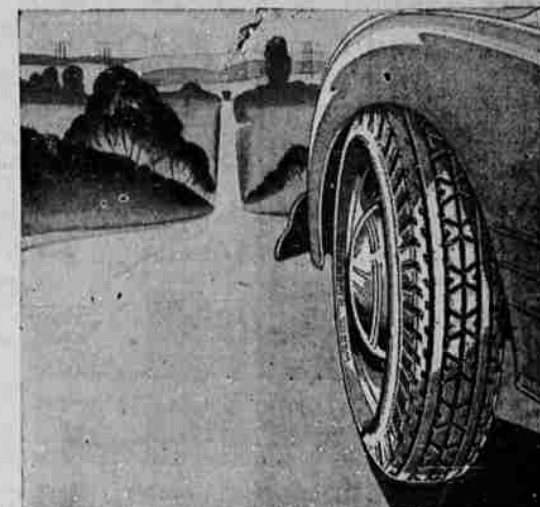

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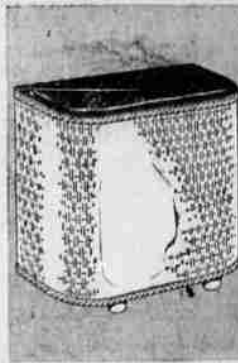
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
