

Achui, Angelo To Top Mat Card At Armory Saturday

Douglas county wrestling fans will be served a grappling "natural" Saturday night at the Roseburg Armory, when Bruno Angelo meets Walter Achui in the headline attraction of Matchmaker Don Owen's weekly mat show.

Probably just as attractive will be a preliminary skirmish between Tex Hager, the erstwhile "Creswell Cyclone," and Jack Kiser, popular grappling speedster from St. Johns.

Angelo, holder of the Pacific coast light-heavyweight championship, hopes to make Saturday's match a stepping stone toward regaining the coast junior heavy title he recently lost to Georges Dusette. The villainous Italian, who nearly upset Ernie Pluss in a world title light-heavy match recently, looked impressive last week in stopping a fellow meanie—Mike Nizarian.

Achui, the Jiu-Jitsu expert who has been wrestled ever to enter the ring, will give Angelo a thorough test. He, too, would like a shot at Dusette and his coast crown and Owen has intimated that the winner of Saturday's inevitable brawl will be in line for a title tilt.

The headliner has long been in demand by Douglas grappling railbirds who are certain they will witness one of the most bruising battles of the local season. Angelo's aggressive, fast style will be more than matched by Achui's long ring experience and his Oriental tactics, which are usually acceptable against a villain.

Chandler Downs Boston Sox, 2 to 1, On 2-Hit Hurling

"Spud" Chandler, new in his tenth season with the New York Yankees and possessing one of the finest lifetime won-and-lost records among the American League's active pitchers, has almost always found the Boston Red Sox one of his most persistent hoodlums.

The 35-year-old right-hander entered the present campaign with only a fair 11-and-eight record against the Red Sox, including two Sox decisions this year. Last night, however, before 68,617 spectators, largest night game crowd in baseball history, Chandler downed the pacemakers 2-1, on two hits for his 12th win of the season as against two defeats.

At that, Chandler caused the New York through some anxious moments as he issued nine walks. But the veteran star bore down in the clutch and fanned nine and was nursing a no-hitter until Doerr singled with one out in the eighth inning.

The Yanks nicked Harris for a run in the second on Dinnaggio's and Etten's double. The final marker came in the third when Stirmweiss singled behind Rizzuto's triple.

Dodgers Boost Lead

Brooklyn's Dodgers increased their National League margin over the St. Louis Cardinals to seven and one-half games by nosing out the Philadelphia Phillies, 3-2, while the Red Birds dropped a 7-5 tilt to the Cincinnati Reds. Lavagetto batted in the Brooks' winning run in the ninth inning when he singled home Relief Pitcher Herring to break a 2-2 deadlock. The win was the Dodgers seventh straight and their tenth in a row over the Phils.

The Reds tallied seven unearned runs in the third inning to hand the slump ridden Cards their fourth straight loss.

Pittsburgh drew to within a game of the sixth place Phils as Heinzelman blanked the Chicago Cubs, 9-0. And the Boston Braves sank the New York Giants deeper into the cellar by scoring a ninth inning 5-4 victory.

Cleveland moved over the St. Louis Browns into fifth place by rapping Shirley of the Browns for 12 hits and a 4-2 win.

Chicago whipped the Tigers 8-7, for their first victory of the year in Detroit. After Greenberg smashed his 20th homer of the year in the opening stanza with

The scheduled twin bill between the Washington Senators and the Philadelphia Athletics was postponed because of threatening weather.

The base umpire called the runner out and the plate umpire's decision was safe. To top off the officials' field day," Huggins said, "The Crescent City's shortstop, on a hidden ball trick tagged the runner before play was officially called back by the umpire-in-chief."

The official protest was made to the association's president, H. W. Gray, who is forwarding it to Secretary Harry Chipman.

Oakland Tumbles Into First Place Tie With Seals

Weeks of steady pursuit from one rung on the ladder below the Oakland A's in the Pacific Coast Baseball League today paid the persistent San Francisco Seals a dividend of a share in the lead.

The lowly Portland Beavers snapped the six-game winning streak of the A's, 5 to 4, Tuesday night, with the aid of whatever pressure the relentless chase by the San Francisco Seals in the pennant race may have exerted.

San Francisco went on to its seventh straight victory, subduing the third-place Los Angeles Angels, 10 to 3, and evening the count with the Oakland outfit at 61 wins and 34 losses apiece. The San Diego Padres blasted the Hollywood Stars, 9 to 1, while Sacramento's Solons hammered out a 10-5 decision over the Seals.

Game Won in Ninth Frame
With the count tied at 4-all by an Oakland ninth-inning rally, Escobar singled with the bases loaded and two out to spell the downfall of the A's. Portland opened up on Ardizola for three tallies in the second frame, added one off Relief Pitcher Hefey in the seventh and nicked Palica for the winner in the finale. Scarsella touched off the Oakland rally with a bases-loaded single.

Fletcher went the distance although he yielded the Rainiers 13 hits, while his Sacramento mates collected 16 safeties off three Seattle chucks. Outfielder Ramsey, traded by Seattle to Sacramento to get Jo Jo White to manage the Rainiers, ploughed his old teammates with three hits worth as many runs.

Duck Hunting Season Likely to Be Shortened
WASHINGTON, July 3.—(AP)—Dr. Albert M. Day, director of the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, is fearful the duck hunting season must be shortened and the

bag limit reduced to insure future breeding stock.

The service recently estimated that the water fowl population had decreased 36 per cent in the past two years while the sale of hunting permits had risen 50 per cent.

The service will announce the season's length and the bag limit later this month or early in August after making another study of its survey figures.

Jake Leicht to Play in Softball Game Here

Local softballers will see All-American Footballer Jake Leicht in action on the diamond Saturday evening, when the Eugene Chamber of Commerce nine meets the Pastime Taverners of Sutherlin at the local city ball park.

An all-around athlete, Leicht will be starting in the outfield with the City League-leading Eugene club, and he is said to be outstanding also as a utility man. The contest will begin at 8 P. M., Jerry Huggins said Tuesday. Huggins recently replaced former Manager Ed Wyatt, who will devote full time to swimming activities for the local recreation department.

Loans Again Available On Oats and Barley

Government loans on 1946-crop oats, barley, and grain are available to farmers under loan programs similar to those in effect on 1945 crops. The loan program enables farmers to put grain crops in storage to benefit from possible better marketing situations than prevail at harvest time, and provide the nation with a reserve against future needs such as continuation of export to famine-stricken countries abroad. The loan rates for farm-stored barley grading No. 1 will vary from 80 cents to 94 cents per bushel in different counties. Oregon rates will be 5 cents a bushel higher than last year.

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
