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New Swimming Program Launched At Templin Beach

The new swimming program, sponsored by the local American Red Cross chapter, opened yesterday at the Templin beach in Roseburg under the direction of Miss Marion "Sonny" Gray.

Not to be confused with the local recreation swimming class, which gave way to the ARC classes for twelve days, this school will also give instruction to beginning swimmers as well as advanced classes. Twenty persons turned out at yesterday's classes, but 50 have signed up and regular classes will be scheduled today.

In addition to the beginners' classes and intermediates, a Junior Life Saving class is to be started, Miss Gray said, for advanced swimmers who, upon completion of the course, will receive certificates and Red Cross swim buttons representing their achievements. Persons completing this course will be used to aid in instruction to others when the Roseburg Recreation office resumes its classes.

Teacher Well Trained

Miss Gray, a resident and former high school student of Roseburg, recently returned from Lake Benbow, Wash., where she attended an aquatic school for Red Cross first aid, water safety and accident prevention instructions. The training received there will enable her to better serve as a life guard and water activities director for this city. Mr. Plumer, chairman of the Douglas County Red Cross chapter, said Monday.

The 10-day school, which featured courses in safe water practice, life saving, first aid and accident prevention, represented one phase of the Red Cross program to "accident-proof" America. Plumer added.

Emphasis was placed at this school on safe use of boats and canoes for vacationers, general water safety and the 1946 changes in the Red Cross first aid text book.

"Everything possible in the way of instruction," Miss Gray said, "was given us to apply Red Cross safety instruction to the peace-time recreation of our various communities, as well as to teach safety and prevention of accidents in the home and on the highways."
