Veteran, 103, Says 'I Don't Drink'

FOREST GROVE, July 8.—(AP)—An old Indian fighter celebrated his 103rd birthday today and said he couldn't figure out how come he'd lived so long.

"Unless it's because I don't drink," said James W. Smith, whose parents brought him across the plains from Missouri to Oregon when he was a year old. "All the other men that I knew that drank, they're all gone."

Still chipper after a century, the Army veteran trudges downtown from his one-room cottage once or twice a week. He served with the Oregon cavalry during the Civil War, pursuing Indians and protecting frontier trails.

After his discharge, he mounted the horse the Army gave him and went prospecting. "Made several good strikes," he declared. "I've made lots of money in my day, but I gave it all away. I've never taken anything off anybody. Even now."

Smith lives alone, supported by his Army pension, and comforted by his inseparable corn-cob pipe.
